Income Tax Provisions

Scored By Tax Expert

MONTREAL (CP)—The tax collector isn't doing right by husbands and wives, a tax expert said today.

L. J. Smith of Toronto complained, on behalf of husbands

and wives, when he spoke at a panel discussion today at the annual conference of the Canadian Tax Foundation.

Mr. Smith said the Income Tax Act seems to have been drafted on the assumption that a husband and wife are inherently conniving tax-evaders and that therefore the tax collector should exact his toll accordingly.

A resume of his remarks was released to the press in advance.

Mr. Smith gave specific examples:

1. When a husband looks after his wife and provides her with all the necessities, these may be treated for tax purposes less favorably than an unmarried man and a dependent sister who have established a home together.

If the unmarried man has an income, for example, of \$2,000 and his dependent sister an income of \$750, the husband pays tax on \$500.

2. If a husband needs help in his business and his wife dutifully works twice as many hours for half the wages he would have to pay anyone else, he can't deduct her meagre wages when computing his business income.

3. If a man marries a woman who has money and brains and she becomes his partner in business,
