**Various Problems Discussed By S'side Board Of Trade**

Mr. Fred Bingham told the Summerside Board of Trade last evening that he has discussed with Dr. Orville Phillips, member of Parliament for Prince County, the need for paving the traffic surface of the Marine Wharf, and the desirability of an extension to storage sheds, and the construction of an inspectors' shed, and a grading shed where potatoes rejected by inspection, can be regraded at the wharf. These further projects would complete very satisfactory potato export facilities at Summerside, he said.
