At a late hour all departed for their homes feeling that a very pleasant evening had been spent.

The large audiences at the People's Theatre, Charlottetown, Saturday night, thoroughly enjoyed the splendid program put on by the management, especially the leading reel, The Vitagraph Monthly, a news picture. This famous reel portrayed the annual parade of the Daughters of veterans of the U. S. Civil War, an exceedingly exciting motor boat race and swimming and diving contest at New York, and an aviation meet. The interest in these portrayals was intense. The other pictures were, 'The girl of the Plains, a scene of the early settlers and a comic film, 'The Baby and the Stork, Miss Wren was in good voice and delighted the people with her singing.

On the question of teachers salaries, which is of much concern in Charlottetown, and in fact the whole province, at the present time, the following is taken from an exchange: "The teachers' salaries in Manitoba are in general very much better than they are in the Province of Quebec. In 1890 the average salary in the rural schools was \$453.46; in 1910 it was \$544.22. In 1890, the average salary for the province was \$488.13; in 1910, it was \$628.25. The highest salary paid in 1890 was \$1,500; the highest in 1910 was \$2,700. Yet good as the salaries to the rural teachers of Manitoba are, compared with those which prevail in this province, Alberta and Saskatchewan are going beyond them, and Manitoba feels the effect. The inspector of the East Central division says: 'Salaries remain about the same and many of the best teachers have gone to the western provinces, where salaries are much higher than they are in Manitoba. It is a serious condition of affairs when our best teachers leave us and only the lower grades remain.' Another inspector complains that some school boards pay the same salary to untrained as to trained teachers. Eastern educators, also, are acquainted with that injurious policy."

They located first at Brudenell, but remained there for only a short time, removing to Lot 48, where they took up 100 acres of land. Here the foundation of the Dewar homestead was laid, the deceased carrying on farming for many years. He was one of a family of ten, but the only surviving member now is his sister, Catherine, widow of the late Rev. Dr. John Knox. Mr. Dewar leaves to mourn a widow, nee Jessie Stewart of South Lake, and three sons, Alfred E. Dewar, Peter Dewar, and Harding Dewar, all of Newlands, when they conduct one of the best orchards in the Province. About ten years ago Mr. Dewar and his wife went to reside with them. The deceased was a devoted member of the Church of Christ, a man of sterling character, who exemplified in his conduct the teachings of the Great Master. The funeral took place Saturday afternoon to the place of the burial, services being conducted by the Rev. J. F. Floyd. The pall-bearers were—James Roper, George Simons, Murdoch MacLeod, Charles Chandler, Benjamin Carter and William Wright. He passed away on Thursday.
