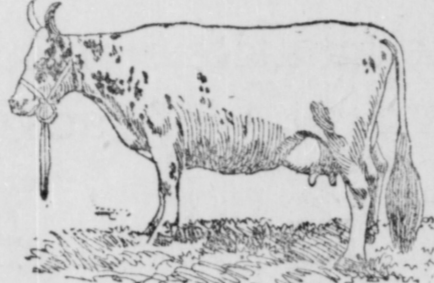

AYRSHIRE.

Good Type of Cow of This Pretty and Use-
ful Breed.

Ayrshire owners and breeders do not
make much noise about their favorite
cattle, and we do not hear half so much
of these cows as of the Jerseys and
Guernseys.

Yet when we remember that the cow
which holds the world's record for
greatest quantity of butter in a given
time was an Australian cross between
Ayrshire and Shorthorn we wonder that
the pretty cow with the polished, black
tipped horn is not more advertised.
One fact none can deny concerning this
breed—namely, that their milk con-

tains more cheese producing substance
in proportion to the total quantity of
solids than that of any other dairy fam-
ily. We have heard lately of a man
whose cows were mostly Jerseys, but
who wished to improve his herd. He
therefore introduced among them an
Ayrshire sire.

form of the one in our illustration can-
not fail to make a big record in the
milk pail. This cow is a favorite prize
winner among Ayrshires.
