

Relations at Low Point Between Germany, France

 BONN (AP)—Relations stand at a low point between the governments of France and West Germany, new friends and old enemies.

The main trouble:

1. Chancellor Erhard's support of the United States on questions of nuclear arms and trade matters.
2. President de Gaulle's new estrangement with Moscow.

Chances for improvement:

1. An offer next week from Chancellor Erhard on a new organization for European political unity, plus some proposals on trade.
2. De Gaulle is not likely to find that there go far enough in giving France a bigger chance to sell its farm products in Germany.

De Gaulle has his old friend, ex-chancellor Adenauer. This may mean man more than anything else. Adenauer and Erhard disagree on relations with France. Adenauer would like to see them a lot closer, as they were when he was chancellor.

Nothing the newly elected U.S. president can do to get France and West Germany pulling smoothly with the United States and Britain.

During the weekend there has been talk of France pulling out of the Atlantic pact. The latest blow to French West German relations is the West German trade agreement with Moscow, giving the Soviet Union up to seven years to pay for major purchases like anti-chemical plants.

The West German government and the United States oppose credits to the Soviet Union for a longer term than five years. The argument is that such credits turn into a kind of economic aid to the Soviet Union, and they see no reason for giving outright aid to Communist countries.

Besides, West German businessmen would have been glad to build those plants in the Soviet Union themselves.

The West German government is always worried about any approach to the Soviet Union by de Gaulle. He has come out in the past in favor of leaving the Communist countries in possession of the territories, gains they made in the Second World War at Germany's expense—another concession Erhard cannot afford to make for fear of angering voters at home.

Attila's advice to the new labor party leader after last month's general election was to move boldly and swiftly on the most controversial aspects of his program.

Russian Rulers Renew Fight With Peking

MOSCOW (AP)—Russian new rulers have reaffirmed their support of the key of former premier Khrushchev's position in the Kremlin's dispute with China.

For a first time since Khrushchev's ouster, the Soviet Communist party organ Pravda attacked "chauvinism and petty bourgeois adventurism... opportunism and dogmatism... distortion of Leninist principles... all epithets hurled at Peking leaders at the height of the Sino-Soviet dispute.

A front page Pravda editorial also repeated Soviet opposition to a world meeting of Communist parties, a Khrushchev project bitterly opposed by the Chinese.
