

GENERAL NEWS.

Speaking of the war the London Standard says that English society will feel the effect of the sudden migration of its liveliest characters to warmer climates.

A mortgage deed of \$1,140,000, said to be the largest individual mortgage on record, was executed in New York, last week. The money borrowed is to be invested in a mammoth apartment house.

A writer in London Truth says that nowadays everything is "smart"—a sermon, a concert, a dinner party, a dance, a dress, a boquet, a wedding or a house, and the other day a man was talking of a "smart" funeral.

Mr. Smith, a Scotch Laird, has bequeathed the whole of his property—about \$500,000—to his servants, a shepherd receiving the bulk. This fortunate legatee has agreed to pay \$157,000 to the heir-at-law and other relatives, who would otherwise attempt to break the will.

MEN WANTED TO GO TO MANITOBA.—J. G. McDonald, the contractor, Winnipeg, advertises in Moneton for teamsters, quarrymen, brickmakers and laborers. He will pay \$50, or \$30 per month and found, to teamsters; \$2.50 per day to quarrymen; \$2.50 to \$3.00 per day to brick makers, and \$2.50 per day to laborers in brick-yards, and work supplied chopping and loading wood in winter.

A number of speculative merchants in Norway have obtained the right of cutting blocks from the great glacier to the Senjen Island. The glacier is about 120 miles square, and the distance from its border to the sea is only two miles. It is believed that the ice can be profitably exported. Blocks have been carried to the city of Bergen, and the quality of the ice is said to be good. It can be advertised as of the crop of the year 1.

STRUCK BY LIGHTNING.—The schooner Moonlight, McLean, master, proceeded to the beach (Halifax), on Wednesday night, where she anchored, waiting favorable wind to go to Shelbourne. About midnight the lightning struck her fore and main-masts, completely demolishing the latter and carrying away the foremast centre piece, splitting rails, &c. The lightning ran along the deck into the cabin, smashing dishes and doing considerable damage. None of the crew were injured. The moonlight will be repaired.
