IN MEMORIAM

MR. PATRICK J. MACINNIS

The sudden departure from this life on July 28, of Patrick J. MacInnis, Postmaster, Borden, was learned with deep regret by the citizens of Borden, relatives and friends far and near. Mr. MacInnis was in his usual good health talking with friends five minutes before God summoned him home, death being due to a heart attack.

The deceased was born at Mount Tryon 59 years ago and was the youngest son of the late Phalen MacInnis and Ambersine MacDonald. The late Mr. MacInnis was Postmaster since 1923. He also served as Mayor and at the time of his death was vice-president of the Canadian Postmasters Association, Maritime Branch, Secretary of School Trustees and a valued Councillor of the Town of Borden.

He leaves to mourn his sorrowing widow, the former Charlotte King, Charlottetown, a daughter, Inez, Toronto, Ont.; a son, Hilary, at home and three brothers, Martin, Alexander and Neil of Albany. The funeral, largely attended, was held from his late residence to the Sacred Heart Church, where Solemn High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Reginald MacDonald, with W. V. MacDonald as Deacon and Rev. W. E. Monaghan as Sub-Deacon, also present in the Sanctuary were Rev. Preston Hamill, Rev. Claude Shea and Rev. Sylvère Gallant. Rev. Reginald MacDonald performed the burial service. Interment is in Seven Mile Bay Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Mayor Willard Leard, Captain Wylie Irving, Messrs. Gilbert Bell, Frank Dorsey, Russell Deignan and William McIvor. The many floral tributes, mass cards and messages of sympathy indicates how the deceased is thought of and remembered. Dedicated to the late Patrick J. MacInnis, from his family.

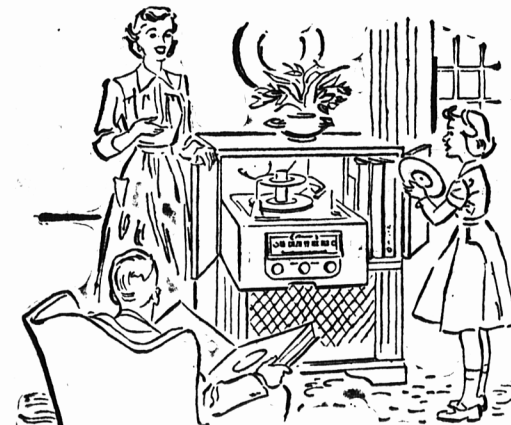

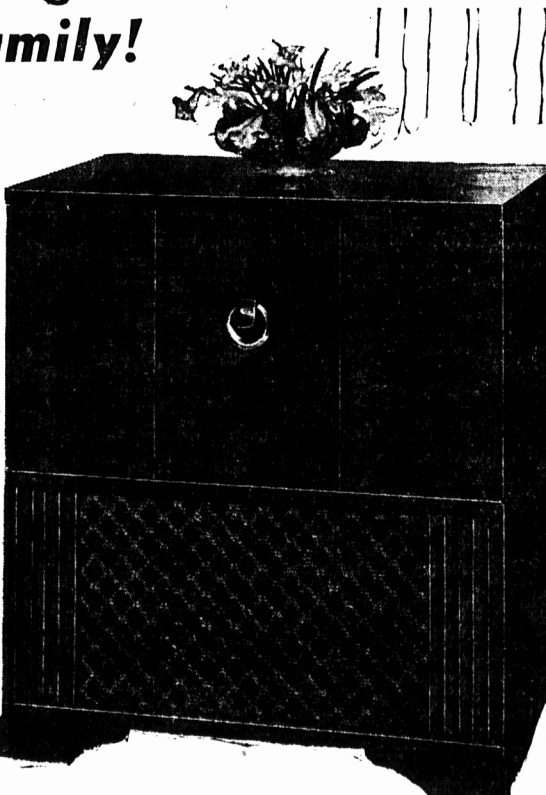
