Candidate Says Election Needed

"It is for the general good of the Canadian nation that a federal election should be held at this time," B.B. Jones of Buxbury, joint Liberal candidate with Mark R. MacGuigan for Queen's, said at the annual meeting of First District Liberals held at Breadalbane Hall last night.

He felt that the time had now come for the exercise of even sounder judgment on the part of the voters.

Mr. Jones maintained that despite the repeated difficulty of obtaining Parliamentary support, the Liberals had made "an impressive showing" during their two and a half years in office. "They have already implemented some 27 of the 34 main planks in their previous platform," he claimed. "That is a batting average of better than 80 per cent."

SDU Enrollment Reaches Record

An all-time record of 1,028 students have registered this year at St. Dunstan's University, it was announced last night by SDU registrar, Michael Hennessey. Of this total, 804 are registered in university programs with the remaining 222 in high school. The registrar noted that the number of full-time students in attendance at the university is 598, while part-time university students total 206. Both figures are new high for SDU. The high school figure is also an increase over last year's record total, UP 10 PER CENT.
