Some 38,107,000 bushels of wheat will be fed to livestock in Canada in the 1951-52 crop year, according to an estimate made by the federal bureau of statistics.

If a grasshopper loses a leg in infancy, a new leg will replace the lost limb when it molts its covering.

Crickets and certain spiders also are capable of growing new limbs when they happen to lose the original digits.

Canada and the U. S. A. now supply 64 per cent of the world's bread grains and 62 per cent of the coarse grains, with millions of acres yet to be brought under cultivation.

The smallest calf ever born in Canada weighed only 10 pounds at birth. Only 24 inches long, it was fed with an eyedropper the first 24 hours. The calf was born on

the J. S. Davey farm at Chesley, Ontario. When sold at six months old it weighed 300 pounds.

In Canada lizards may be found only along the International Border. Salamanders are often mistaken for lizards.

The popular notion that lizards and salamanders will not live in captivity is an utterly false one. Quite a number of persons raise these creatures in captivity.

People also raise earthworms, snakes, lady-bugs, caterpillars and a score or so of other insects and reptiles because they make money doing it.

Take, ladybugs for instance, they destroy the mealy-bugs so fatal to orange groves. Raised in vast numbers and sold to fruit growers, the ladybugs bring their owners a good revenue.

One of the largest ladybug farms I know of is in California. On the site are 23 buildings, each with 6 rooms packed full of insects. 20 men are employed to take care of the nurseries. The bugs consume in a single year 5,000 sacks of the best spuds that can be purchased. The temperature of the nursery must be kept at approximately 80 degrees, and the larvae are grown on potato sprouts.

The bugs are put up for delivery in capsules, ten insects to a capsule and the fruit farmer uses one capsule for each infested tree.

The ladybugs clean an orchard of pesky bugs in short order as they are very industrious.

Charlottetown had its full share of thieving this past summer, but to date none of the light-fingered tribe have stolen a train. Such a theft actually took place in Vancouver some little time ago, when 27-year-old James MacLeod stole one of B. C. Electric's Company trains. The case was dismissed, however, when magistrate Mackenzie Matheson said he had no precedent on which to base the decision.

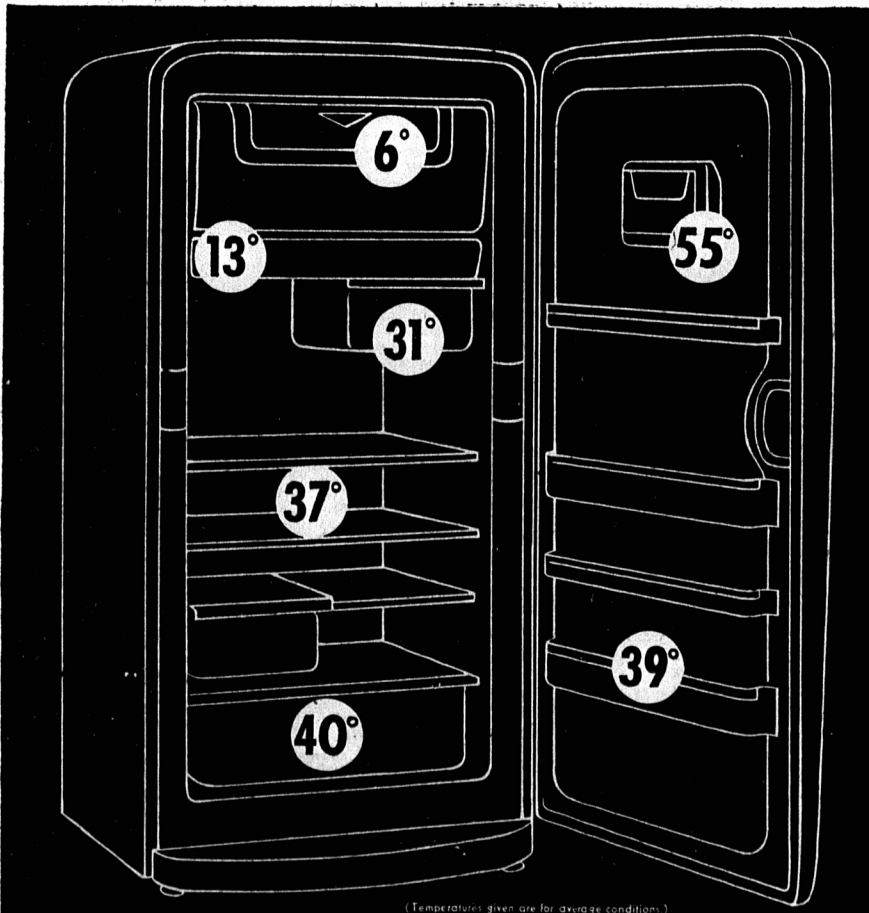

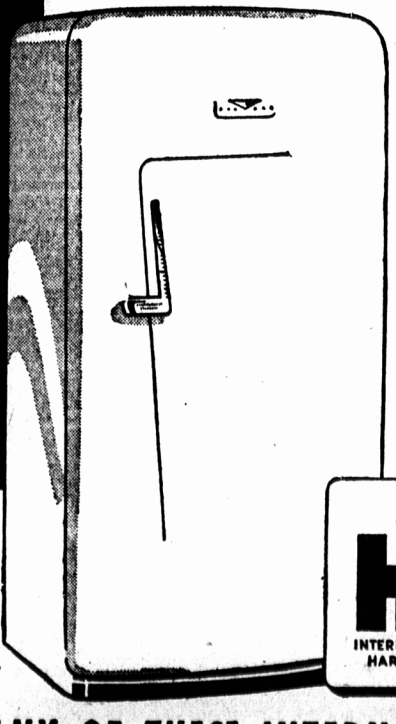
