### Let's Talk It Over

We read a very fine editorial recently which applauded the efforts of the Summerside service clubs in sponsoring and promoting "Little League" baseball, but which deplored the fact that now-a-days youngsters seem to give little thanks to those who make it possible for them to enjoy athletics with all the advantages of proper equipment, coaching, etc. The editorial gave the opinion that the more you do for our youth today, the less appreciative, and the more demanding they become. To all of which we are forced reluctantly to agree. There was one little phrase, however, that we feel may supply the answer to the problem which the unsatisfactory condition raises. The writer intimated that the program had for its chief aim the health and physical welfare of the boys concerned.

That may be our chief trouble. Should physical fitness be the chief concern of the promoters? Should we be satisfied if we can develop 300 hitters, accomplished base-runners and brilliant fielders? Or should we work into this sports program an ulterior, but far more important aim, that of developing good citizens? The editorial in question suggested that character training should go hand in hand with the teaching of baseball skills, but the question arises: Which is really the more important of the two?

Those who take the lead in promoting sports for youth have a marvelous opportunity. School teachers who try to instill "good citizen" habits in their charges are working under a considerable handicap, for children, especially those who need moral guidance most, very often consider school and everything connected with it a necessary evil. Unless the teacher is very clever and for the purpose born, the idea of being forced to do things will become associated with the character training, as well as the academic training, and disappointing results will be frequent.

The sports leader is teaching the boys something they love to learn. He is their guide in a work which is verily a labor of love. If proper character training is woven into this beloved activity, it will be tied up with pleasant associations, and have a much better chance of making an impression. Give the sometimes unpalatable pills of unselfishness, good sportsmanship and tolerance a sugar-coating of baseball, and who knows what wonders may be performed!
