## Provincial Legislature. Many Are Disappointed.

### House of Assembly.

#### THEY FAIL TO SECURE FREEDOM FROM SUFFERING

##### Because They Use Worthless Remedies.

MONDAY, April 10.

House met at 4 30 p. m.

The Speaker submitted the resolutions passed at the citizens' meeting in Market Hall on Friday evening, protesting against the disfranchisement of employees of the Dominion Government.

An act respecting Montague Hall was read a third time and passed.

Mr. Gordon asked for information as to what progress had been made in the matter of providing a steamer for Cardigan Ferry?

Hon. Mr. McLean said the matter would be considered.

The act incorporating the Kensington Hall Company was read a third time and passed.

Hon. Mr. Peters submitted a bill amending the Summerside Incorporation Act.

House then resumed committee of supply. Mr. Robertson in the chair.

A lengthy discussion took place on the grant for exhibition purposes. Messrs. Underhay and Matheson put in claims for grants for exhibitions at Souris and Alberton, and Mr. Bell protested against the manner in which exhibitions at Summerside were managed.

At the evening session, Mr. Clow asked for a statement of all fines collected under the Canada Temperance Act and on whom they were imposed.

Hon. Mr. Peters said the Government would give such information as they thought in the interests of the public.

House then resumed committee of supply, and exhibition and other items were passed.

The item of \$1000 for Paris green provoked considerable discussion.

Hon. Mr. Peters explained that the Government would first ascertain where the bug was at work and place the Paris green in the hands of persons living in the neighborhood who would sell it to those desirous of purchasing.

House adjourned at 11 45.

TUESDAY, April 12.

This forenoon the House met at 11 45.

Mr. Underhay asked the Commissioner of Public Lands if he had received a petition from Thomas Monahan praying that he should be allowed to purchase land held by him on Lot 45 on terms as favorable as those obtained by purchasers of adjoining lands; and if so it was recommended that the prayer of the petition be granted.

Hon. Mr. McMillan replied that he had referred the petition to the Government without any recommendation.

Mr. Shaw asked the Commissioner of Public Works for a statement showing in detail the names of all the parties in each township, separately, who had paid their accounts in full in the Land Office during the financial year 1892, showing the balance due by each at the time of settlement, the amount paid by each to square his account during the year 1892, and date of last previous payment, the discount allowed each by virtue of the Statute 55 Vic., Cap. 2, and the amount of reduction in each account by compound interest, separately, if any, and any other reduction that may have been made.

Hon. Mr. McMillan said the statement was being prepared.

Mr. Bell asked for a statement of moneys received into the Registry Office from Prince, King's and Queen's Counties. Also a statement of the moneys paid for extra work in the office.

Mr. Peters said the statement would be brought down.

Mr. Shaw repeated the question asked some days ago regarding the importation of stock for the Stock Farm, the price paid, the agents employed, and their remuneration.

Hon. Mr. Peters said the statement was being prepared, and would be submitted as soon as possible. In many cases, said he, it will be impossible to give all the details asked by the Opposition in the questions they placed on the order book.

Mr. H. C. McDonald asked the Commissioner of Public Works if a petition had been received from the inhabitants of Orwell and Murray Harbor Road praying for the opening of a new road from the Orwell Head Road to Clarke's corner; also, what action the Government intend to take in the petition of the inhabitants of Point Prim praying that the Point Prim Road at its junction with Portage Road be straightened, and a portion of the old road closed.

Hon. Mr. McLean said that the petition had been received and would be favorably considered by the Government.

The Act amending the Act incorporating the Town of Summerside was read a second time in committee, Mr. J. E. Macdonald in the chair. The bill provides for the taxation of banks. Clauses respecting appeals from assessment and the taxing of money lenders and brokers were struck out, and the bill, as amended, was reported agreed to.

Mr. Montgomery submitted a bill to amend the act to incorporate the trustees of Malpeque Hall. Read a first time, read a second time, committed and reported agreed to, read a third time and passed.

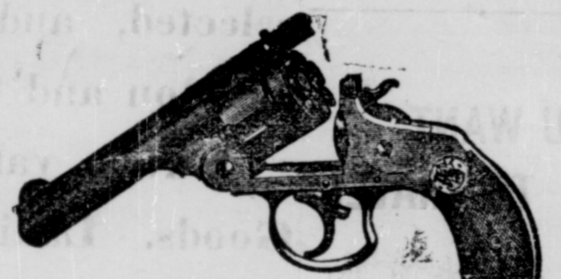
