Diversion Of Princess Pats To Japan Seen As Possibility At Ottawa

OTTAWA, Dec. 7 (CP)—The possibility, even probability, that Canadian troops now en route to Korea will be diverted to Japan was seen here today as officials canvassed Canada's abilities to provide more air aid in the Korean crisis.
