WAKEFIELD, Yorkshire, England, Dec. 29 (AP)—Dr. Alan Nunn May—who peddled atom secrets to the Russians for \$700 and two bottles of whisky—slipped out of prison a free man today.

Soviet records at May's trial showed he got money and whisky for his secrets. He admitted slipping the Russians samples of uranium used in making the first U.S. atom bomb.

Substantial Increase Shown In Fishery Figures This Year

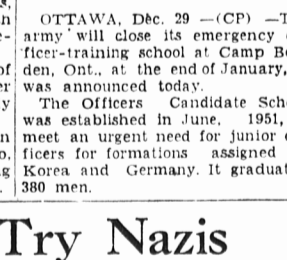
