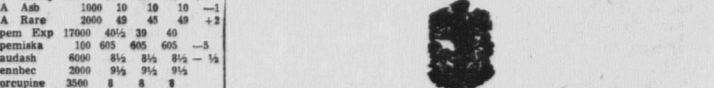

ROYAL COMMISSION ON BANKING AND FINANCE

Submissions and Public Hearings
Public hearings will be held in Eastern Canada as follows:
Date City Place of Hearing
June 4 to 6, Fredericton, N. B. York County Court House.
June 7 and 8, Ch'town, P. E. I. Charlottetown Court House.
June 11 to 13, Halifax, N. S. Red Room, Province House.
June 14 to 16, St. John's, Nfld. Sir Robert Bond Auditorium, Confederation Bldg.

Hearings will start at 9.15 a.m. each day. Briefs are invited from organizations, associations, and individuals wishing to submit information and proposals relating to the work of the Commission which has the following terms of reference:
(a) to enquire into and report upon the structure and methods of operation of the Canadian financial system, including the banking and monetary system and the institutions and processors involved in the flow of funds through the capital market; and
(b) to make recommendations
(i) for the improvement of the structure and operations of the financial system and, more particularly,
(ii) concerning the Bank Act, the Bank of Canada Act, the Quebec Savings Banks Act, and other relevant federal legislation.

Submissions (25 copies) should be in writing and should reach the Secretary not later than March 15, 1962. While the Commission will endeavour to hear as many submissions as possible, it can give no undertaking that it will be feasible to give a public hearing to all those who submit briefs. Further details relating to the submission of briefs and conduct of the hearings may be obtained by writing to:
