

Rotarians Addressed By Bishop Of Charlottetown

"Seventy-five per cent of the world population are living under sub-standard conditions," His Excellency Bishop MacEachern told Rotarians in addressing the members at the regular weekly meeting held at the Charlottetown hotel yesterday. "We must sit down and consider various events which are bound to accompany our day and age. We are bound to have an impact on the Orientals when they become conscious of their situation and might eventually have to bow to their decisions as the masses become educated, unless we forestall them with effective leadership along high level lines," Bishop MacEachern said.

Touching on the development of the electrical and machine agencies, he said the five hour and even four hour day is bound to come, leaving many hours of leisure for which something should be provided to keep people out of mischief. "The culture of civilization has been advanced by music and art but we must keep our eyes and ears open and endeavor to do more."

His Excellency said he had followed with keen interest, the splendid work brought to light at the recent musical festival and expressed amazement at the scope and thoroughness of the movement in this Province.

In his opening remarks Bishop MacEachern said he was very grateful for his reception today and ever since coming to the Island "people have been most friendly and I feel quite at home."

Speaking at a Liberal political meeting last night in Montague, Hon. Keir Clark, Provincial Treasurer, made a reference to the Dominion-Provincial tax conference to be held at Ottawa in the fall. He said that he was prepared to ask that this Province be granted subsidies or allowances under the tax rental agreement "not to compensate us for the revenue from the tax fields we have given up, but to compensate us for the equivalent of such revenue as would be produced from such tax fields in the richest province, that of Ontario."

Mr. Clark said he had reason to hope that the Federal Government may accept such a proposal and if so it would mean greatly increased revenue for this Province.

Potato Tariff Case Being Reported By Hort. Council

An announcement from the Canadian Horticultural Council indicates that the Potato Committee under the chairmanship of Mr. W. R. Shaw, will lead the presentation on behalf of the Canadian Potato Industry. While the Tariff Board has suggested that briefs be filed at least ten days prior to the hearing on June 13th, it has been arranged by agreement with the Tariff Board that:

(1) Provincial members of the committee will prepare and submit briefs to the Council on or before June 1st.

(2) Copies of briefs will be prepared for review by all members of the committee.

(3) A meeting of the committee and others who may wish to attend, to be held in Ottawa, Friday, June 10th.

(4) During the meeting the views of the various districts will be coordinated so as to avoid repetition, and arrangements will be made for proper presentation.

Mr. Shaw who is also a member of the Trade and Tariff Committee has been in touch with leaders in the potato areas across Canada and briefs from these areas are now in course of preparation. Full supporting evidence as required will be presented from these areas.

Representing this province on the National Committee, in addition to Mr. Shaw is Mr. Donald MacDonald. These two gentlemen have been in close touch with Council representatives for years are contacting other groups in the province including the Federation of Agriculture for the purpose of preparing a complete statement for the Council and the Board. They are pleased that this investigation will now be undertaken and feel that the strong representations they made during February of this year, before Maritime members and Government Ministers including the Finance Minister Hon. Walter Harris, is now bringing results.

Recently returned from Winnipeg, Mr. MacNaught has been exceptionally busy in preparing a presentation of a bill to implement an International Fishing Conservation Agreement for the fisheries of the Great Lakes. Today, his explanations and those of Fisheries Minister Sinclair were received with notable interest and approval by members of the Marine and Fisheries Committee of the Commons. Owing to intense preparation of his sub-junct matter, Mr. MacNaught was able to give clear and concise answers to questions asked him by members from all parts of the country.

At St. John's, Mr. MacNaught will represent the government of Canada at a special ceremony there on May 26. On that date a Portuguese fishing fleet will dock at St. John's and clergy accompanied by vessel captains, will present a statue of the Madonna of Fatima to the Roman Catholic Cathedral of the Newfoundland capital. The presentation will be in appreciation by the fishermen and government of Portugal of the cordial relations which have prevailed for generations between their country and Newfoundland and the co-operation extended by Newfoundland to the Portuguese fishermen.

Britain had said previously it would contribute \$200,000. Australia will also participate and possibly South Africa.

The other Commonwealth countries, it is understood, had hoped that Canada would take part because of its Arctic experience. There have been reports that Sir Edmund Hillary, co-conqueror of Everest, will be a member of the expedition.
