

Thinks Nashu Will Win Kentucky Derby In May

NEW YORK (AP)—Jockey Ted Atkinson has three words for Nashua—"unconquered," "responsive" and "unnerving"—but he figures the headstrong Belair colt is a dead cinch to win the Kentucky Derby May 7.

"If he can spot Summer Tan the lead he did in the Wood last Saturday and catch him over a mile and an eighth," the 38-year-old Toronto-born saddlemith said Monday. "Then he's bound to run off and leave him in a mile and a quarter."

Nashua and Summer Tan, prime favorites in what stacks up as a "two-horse" Derby, will have to go an extra eighth of a mile at Louisville Saturday week.

Describing Nashua's thrilling neck victory over Summer Tan in the Wood Memorial after the latter had cut him over a mile and hit the stretch 1 1/2 lengths in front, Atkinson said:

"Some horses respond completely, are eager to do all they can others over-respond and still others under-respond."

HEADSTRONG COLT

"Nashua falls into the last category. He is a headstrong colt. To describe him, I would say he is ungenerous. That is, he refuses to give when the rider asks him to give when he wants to."

Atkinson was a substitute rider Saturday for Eddie Arcaro who is sitting out a suspension. Arcaro will be aboard in the Derby.

But Atkinson said Arcaro had found the same habits in the Belair stud speedster.

"I have never ridden a horse of Nashua's ability which had similar habits," said Atkinson, who rides like a thief and talks like a college professor.

More than 3,000 winners and netted owners close to \$15,000,000 in winnings.

London Sports Editor Says Champion Cockell Would Be Lost To U.K.

LONDON. (AP)—A London sports editor said Monday the International Boxing Club has signed England's Don Cockell to a three-year contract and that the pudgy Briton should upset heavy-weight champion Rocky Marciano, he may never be seen in a British ring again.

In an article headlined: "A champion Don would be lost to British ring, Pat Reekie wrote in The Daily Mail:

"Now the ghastly truth is out. In order to get his fight with Rocky Marciano, Don Cockell, our heavy-weight champion, had to sign away his freedom to fight where he likes, or even where his manager tells him."

Reekie quoted Cockell's manager, John Simpson, as saying: "I knew it was not the normal practice, but what could we do?"

TITLE FIGHTS TIED UP

British promoter Jack Solomons, however, denied that Cockell, as a world champion would be "lost forever" to British rings but admitted Don is tied up with the

IBC for title fights.

"Cockell can fight wherever he likes and whenever he likes," said Solomons who works closely with the IBC. "I was there when the contract was made and he is free to have as many 10-round fights as he wants. He does not have to ask the IBC."

"He is tied up with the IBC for title fights," added Solomons, "but even that wouldn't prevent him from defending his title in England if the offer was right. In that case, I would have to give a share of the profits to Jim Norris, president of the IBC."

"Solomons is absolutely correct," said Harry Markson, managing director of the IBC, in New York.

"All we ask of Cockell, if he signs, is that he defend the title at least twice a year," said Markson. "There is nothing to prevent him from defending the title in England or anywhere else if the terms are right."

Cockell, a 5-1 underdog, is training in San Rafael, Calif., for his May 16 bout with Marciano in San Francisco.

Rip Repulski Leading National League Batting

NEW YORK (AP)—Hitting behind Stan Musial must be an aspiration. At least it's doing wonders for Eldon (Rip) Repulski, the new cleanup batter for St. Louis Cardinals.

With the 1955 major league season two weeks old Monday, Repulski leads the National League in batting with a .396 average on 19 hits in 48 times at bat. In 10 games, the 26-year-old outfielder from Sauk Rapids, Mich., also has produced five doubles, two homers and nine runs batted in.

In his first 10 games last season, Repulski hit .258 with not a homer and only one run-batted-in. He finished with a .213 mark.

Al Kaline, the speedy outfielder of Detroit Tigers, has taken an early lead in the American League batting race. He's batting an even .500 with 19 safeties in 38 trips after 10 games.

Kaline also is the only major leaguer to have hit three homers in one game this season. He has four circuit blows, in all, and is right behind Bob Nieman of Chicago White Sox, who leads with five. Nieman is second to Kaline in batting with a .423 percentage.

TOPS FOR RBI

Bill Skowron of New York Yankees, who is setting the runs batted in pace along with Nieman at 14 apiece, is third in the hitting competition with a 4.22 mark. Chico Carrasquel of Chicago is fourth with 4.00 followed by Vic Power of Kansas City with .381 and Harvey Kuenn of Detroit with .372.

Behind Repulski in the National League came Johnny Logan of Milwaukee Braves with .369.

Dutchies' Coach Glad He Delayed Lineup Shift

KITCHENER, Ont. (CP)—A bit of misinformation almost had right winger Jack McKenzie of Kitchener-Waterloo Dutchmen playing defence Saturday night instead of his customary right wing spot.

The Dutchies' coach Bob Bauer is glad they didn't make the move. McKenzie scored three goals in Kitchener's 6-2 win over Fort William Beavers in the third game of their Allan Cup final here. Dutchmen now lead the series 2-1.

Bauer considered the switch Saturday night when he heard, one hour before game time, that defenceman Joe Schertz had been injured in an accident at his home and was in hospital awaiting treatment.

Bauer decided to move McKenzie back when he walked Schertz. It turned out Joe had phoned earlier to say he was just going to hospital for a minor treatment of a toe injury suffered earlier in the playoffs.

The fourth game of the series will be played here Tuesday.

Brooklyn's Strong Spurt And Failure Of Cleveland Pitching Feature 1955 Baseball

NEW YORK, (AP)—Easily the most dramatic occurrence of the young major league baseball season was Brooklyn's record-breaking 10-game winning streak right from the start. But there were many other surprising events.

The shabby pitching of Cleveland's highly touted mound staff, the anaemic batting of Cincinnati's reputed power-packed lineup, the faltering start of the world champion New York Giants and the unexpected fine all-round performance of Boston Red Sox and Chicago Cubs have caused experts to revise their pre-season dope.

The Dodgers threatened to rip the National League apart until they were slowed by the Giants. The most significant feature of their streak was the splendid work of the pitchers. With the exception of Don Newcombe, all starters turned in notable performances.

PITCHING LAMENTABLE

The Indians, who counted on taking charge right off the bat, are barely over 500 with six victories against five defeats. With the exception of Bob Lemon, their pitching has been lamentable. Lemon has hurled two of the tribe's four complete games.

Herb Score, the much-ballyhooed southpaw who was expected to wow them in the majors, has done little to distinguish himself thus far.

Even the two-out-of-three conquest of Brooklyn failed to lift the Giants' spirits. Manager Leo Durocher is still looking for one of his big three—Sal Maglie, Johnny Antonelli and Ruben Gomez—to win one. They've dropped five.

The most confused manager in baseball today must be Birdie Tebbets, the boss of the Redlegs. This was supposed to be the "greatest hitting team" in Cincinnati history. So after 12 games the team is hitting exactly .218 with six regulars under .250.

The Cubs, generally picked to finish seventh, have been getting surprisingly good pitching from Sam Jones, Warren Hacker, Paul Minner and Bob Rush, and even better hitting from Dee Fondy, Jim Norris and Ernie Banks and catcher Harry Chitt.

The Red Sox have been getting unexpected help on the attack from Faye Throneberry, Ted Williams' replacement in left field. The pitching, headed by Frank Sullivan and Willard Nixon, has been a revelation. Nixon's last two starts resulted in 10 victories. Among the individual performers, the hitting of Bob Nieman, of the White Sox and Al Kaline of the Tigers, have been the eye-catchers. Nieman, a throw-in in Chicago's six-player trade with Detroit last winter, currently is tied for the league lead in the runs-batted-in department with 14

and leads in homers with six. He is hitting .423. Kaline, who slammed three home runs in one game recently, tops both leagues with a .500 average.

Dodger Manager Fined

BROOKLYN (AP)—Brooklyn Dodger manager Walter Alston was notified by the National League front office Monday he had been fined \$50 for his run-in with plate umpire Babe Pinelli in Friday night's game between the Dodgers and New York Giants.

It marked the first time in his career a fine had been levied against the former school teacher, either as a player or manager.

The infraction resulted from an argument Alston had with Pinelli in the eighth inning when the veteran arbiter called Don Zimmer of the Dodgers out at home on a squeeze bunt by Jackie Robinson. The usually mild-mannered Alston was ejected by Pinelli presumably because of using "objectionable language."

Actually it was the second time this year Alston had been humiliated out of a game. During spring training Ed Hurley, American League umpire, ordered him off the field for arguing too strenuously against a decision in an exhibition game with New York Yankees.

Says Yanks May Lose Athletic Lead To Reds

NEW YORK (AP)—Avery Brundage, president of the International Olympic Committee, said Monday Americans had become "a race of grandstand and bleacher sitters" and were in grave danger of losing their athletic supremacy to Russia.

"We think it is sport to find a good vantage point in the stands and watch professional baseball, football, boxing and horse racing," he added in an article in this week's Saturday Evening Post.

"This is not sport. These vents shouldn't even be carried on the sports pages. They should be described in the amusement sections

of newspapers, along with the theatre, circus and vaudeville." Brundage, who spent three weeks looking over the Soviet sports program last summer as a guest of the Russian Olympic committee, said everywhere "even in remote little villages I saw evidence of tremendous athletic development."

"Russia is building the greatest mass army of athletes the world has even known. Unless there is a sudden awakening in this country, Soviet sportsmen are almost certain to dominate the 1956 Olympic Games at Melbourne, Australia."

WINDSOR, England. (AP)—Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh reviewed a parade of 1,000 scouts in the Windsor Castle quadrangle Sunday. The marchers were Queen Scouts, the highest rank in scouting in Britain.
