

Dr. Price's Sacrifice. REVIVAL OF DRUIDISM IN THE WELSH HILLS. (London Daily Telegraph, Jan. 15.)

The inhabitants of Pontybridd were on Sunday night startled by flames on the top of a hill near the residence of the well-known Dr. Price, who claims to represent the Druids and dresses in their ancient costume. It was soon bruited abroad that the doctor was engaged in cremating the body of an infant, and hundreds of inhabitants gathered around him. Popular indignation was intense, but nobody dared to interfere, as the doctor threatened to shoot the first one who did so. The body of the child was in a barrel shot up to a great height. Dr. Price was, however, observed, chanting the supposed Druidical incantations. At length the constable seized him, from behind, the fire was extinguished, and the charred body of the infant was discovered, and, with Dr. Price, taken to the police station, great difficulty experienced in preventing the crowd from lynching him. Yesterday morning he was taken before the stipendiary and remanded till to-morrow. The inquest on the infant takes place to-day. From the well known enthusiasm of Dr. Price in all that pertains to Druidism it is supposed he was disposing of the body according to Druidical rites. The child's birth was never registered, its mother having been fined for non-registration. The death also was not registered, the doctor's views on social ethics being peculiar as his costume, which consists of fox-skin cap with tail for tassel, white tunic, and green trousers with scarlet stripes. The Doctor is well known in connection with Gorsedd meeting at the Eisteddfod. Hitherto popular sympathy has been in his favor but this last escapade has caused much indignation in Pontybridd and neighborhood. Dr. Price has been a member of the medical profession fully half a century, and has been known as an advocate of Druidism and a decided believer in cremation. He has, it is understood, expressed a wish that when he dies his body shall be burned, and has had an oven built at his house for this purpose.

A Floating Theatre.

Over thirteen years ago the Chapman family, well-known on the Pacific coast, had a floating theatre on the Mississippi river. Uncle George Chapman and wife were fond of relating stories of their experience in their floating play-house. Mrs Chapman often asserted that the happiest days of her life were spent in the floating theatre. Among other things she related that on one occasion, while the play of Hamlet was in progress, an actor playing the part of Polonius, who was waiting his cue to go upon the stage, made use of his spare moment in angling. He had just got a famous bite when he was called to the stage, upon which he ran, holding his line behind him in his hand. Presently that part was reached in which Hamlet says, "It is backed like a wensel," replied Polonius. "Or like a whale?" questions Hamlet. "Very much like a whale," returned Polonius. As he pronounced these words the actor felt that he had hooked his game, and, suddenly giving his whole attention to his line, he hauled upon the stage, before the eyes of the astonished audience, a famous cat-fish, all alive and kicking. The fish burst down the house and also Hamlet, to whom the landing of the semblance of a whale was an incident most unexpected.—Virginia (Nev.) Enterprise.
