39 Stores Mark Anniversary As Clover Farm In 2nd Year

Natives Envy Canadians

MACKINAC ISLAND, Mich. (CP)—A teen-age son of a Pakistani major - general says Canadians in Pakistan under the Colombo plan are making native workers "very jealous" of their way of life.

Ahmed Hayaud - Din, son of Maj.-Gen. Hayaud-Din, Pakistan military attaché in Washington, told the summit strategy conference of Moral re-Armament Tuesday.

"The Canadians have built their own bowling alleys, swimming pools and night clubs to remind them of all the fun they had in Canada, but it has made our workers who have never even seen these things very jealous."

"As you know our standard of living is very much lower than Canada's and our people sometimes don't earn enough to eat properly."

"Some of our engineers and workers have been going out dancing at the night clubs with the wives of the Canadian engineers. The Canadian husbands don't like it one bit and the wives of the workers don't like it one bit either."

"There is a Communist influence in this relationship between our workers and the wives of the Canadian engineers and it is doing a lot of damage to both countries."

"We will have to accept an ideology like Moral re-Armament and give it to the Canadians if they are not going to give it to us."

Famed 'Marco Polo's Anchor Being Taken To N.B. Museum
