Steel Co. Seeks Page-Hersey Tubes Control

HAMILTON (PC)—The Steel Company of Canada has moved to acquire control of Page-Hersey Tubes Limited, Canada's biggest manufacturer of steel pipes, in an offer worth about \$9,000,000.

In a joint announcement, the companies said an offer is being made to shareholders by Stelco to buy all the outstanding common shares of the Welland-based Page-Hersey complex on a share exchange basis.

On the basis of Friday's opening prices on the Toronto Stock Exchange (Stelco \$24, Page-Hersey \$22) the offer would amount to \$27.70 per Page-Hersey share. Page-Hersey's board of directors has approved the offer and will recommend shareholders accept when the formal offer is made as soon as a prospectus has been filed under the Companies Act.

Immediately following news of the offer would be made, the stock of Page-Hersey jumped \$4 to \$25.25 on a turnover of 36,000 shares. Stelco stock remained unchanged at \$23 1/2 on turnover of 16,000 shares.
