The Quebec Legislature meets on the 28th May.

A NEW glass factory is about to be started in Montreal.

We regret to learn that Hon. Judge Peters is seriously ill.

Steamship "Prince Edward" returned from Picton this morning.

The market was very well attended to-day. Prices the same as on Friday.

SENATORS Haythorne and Montgomery arrived from Ottawa last night.

Bark "Ralph B. Peake," Haben master, arrived at Philadelphia on the 5th inst.

A WOMAN and two children were burned to death in Quebec a few days ago, while lighting fires with coal oil.

THE N. P.—A schooner having on board about thirty tons weight of machinery for the Royalty Pottery, arrived from Halifax to-day.

THE Rev. Mr. Hammond has concluded his revival labors in Montreal. It is claimed that over 1,500 conversions have taken place.

MR. PETER GUNN, for seven years editor of the Summerside Journal died on Sunday last. Mr. Gunn was a correct and vigorous writer.

A LOT of real estate was sold in Chicago a few days ago for \$2,500 a front foot. This is the largest sum ever paid for real estate in that city.

THE train for Summerside last evening brought forty fat cattle, which were selected for shipment to England per "Prince Edward," by Messrs. Carvell Bros., and Blake Bros.

AN hotel keeper was summoned before the Stipendiary Magistrate to-day, for illicit liquor selling. He denied the charge and the case was adjourned until to-morrow for evidence.

A PRIZE FIGHT is to take place at Simcoe, Ont., on the 18th inst., between two American pugilists. Preparations are being made to prevent it by the Canadians, and three Militia companies will be held in readiness in case their services are required.

WHO CAN VOTE.—It appears that there are only two franchises for the coming civic election. First, the freeholder owning property of the value of \$100 and upwards. Second, the leaseholder who pays an annual rental of \$14 and upwards. The statute requires that all assessment due shall be paid by the freehold elector. But no assessment has as yet been levied on the freehold in this city, and it is, therefore, doubtful whether the freehold qualification is good.
