DAMAGE BY LIGHTNING.—A short but sharp and severe lightning storm passed over Yarmouth shortly before 7 o'clock last Friday morning. Rain fell in torrents and was accompanied by vivid lightning and heavy thunder. The new dwelling house of Mr. Harry K. Lewis was struck. The lightning entered the main chimney, knocking off about 25 bricks and splitting it to the roof. It appears to have passed in two directions—one following a rafter on the western side and escaping under the eaves, splitting the rafter. The other and more serious, followed along the ridge spreading the two sides of the roof apart about two inches until it reached the other chimney, which it damaged slightly. Fortunately no one in the house was hurt, but all were very much alarmed.—Telegram.

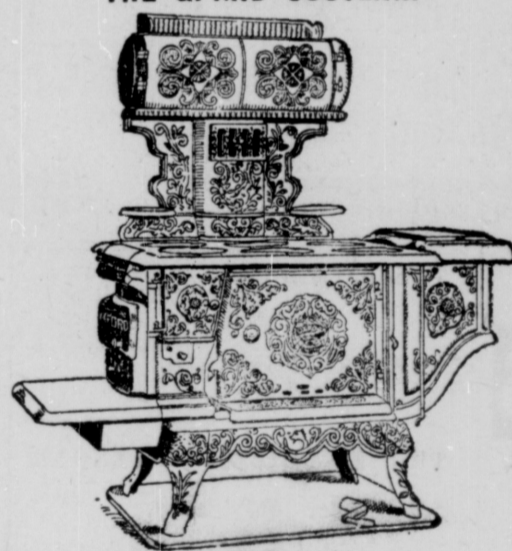
