LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL (CP)—Cattle prices were steady to 50 cents higher, calves firm to \$1 higher, hogs steady to \$1 lower, sheep steady to \$1 lower and sheep and lambs steady to \$1 higher than the Montreal market. Trading was fairly active under a moderate demand.

Receipts were: 2,018 cattle, 1,736 calves, 954 hogs and 173 sheep and lambs. Last week's cattle receipts were 2,268.

Good steers sold at 28.75-27.25, medium 21-28.10 and common 14.25-21.50. Good heifers were 20.75-23.25, medium 17.50-20 and common 12.75-20.

Good cows sold at 18-18.25, medium 15.50-16.50, common 13-15.50 and canners' and cutters 6.13-30. Bulls were 18.50-21.25 and medium and common 13.75-19.25.

Good weaners sold at 30-34 with a few to 37, medium 24-30, common 19-25, yearlings 19-18, and yearlings 12.50-16.

Good lambs were 20-21 and those for ritual slaughter 22-25. Grade A hogs sold at 28-30.75 on the west-end market and sows 21-22, while on the east-end market grade A hogs were 25.25 to 28.25 plus 80 cents each and sows 19-21.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—General Motors moved to a record high 88 1/2 over, all stock market closed upward Thursday amid cross currents to post a moderate net gain. Trading was this week's most active.

Chrysler and Lockheed were steady in the market, with Chrysler's shares to make new highs for 1962 as volume swelled to 4,220,000 shares from 4,000,000 Wednesday.

GM touched a record high of 89 1/2 before closing at 89 1/2 for a net gain of 1/2 over Wednesday's closing price.

The Dow Jones industrial average made a small gain to 10,553 at 648.55. Gains in the average were accounted for by selective demand for blue-chip stocks in various groups. Although the auto industry is expecting a near-record year, motor stock prices were thoroughly scrambled.

Chrysler, the biggest recent gainer, made a one-cent advance, touched a new 1962 high of 75 1/2 but closed with a net loss of 1/4 at 74 1/2. Ford was unchanged, American Motors up 1/4, and Studebaker down 1/4.

Among Canadian issues, Walker Godefrid was up 1/4 and Hudson Bay Mining added another point. Levers were Dime Mines, off 1/4 and Granby Mining 1/4.

Prices on the American Stock Exchange were irregularly higher on volume of 1,200,000 shares compared with 1,000,000 Wednesday. Seary Rainbow Oil was off 1/4, Shawinigan gained 1/4.
