### Yanks And Twins Cop Easy Verdicts

Hickory Mantle pitched a tremendous home run and in addition drove in four runs Wednesday as New York Yankees rolled to their sixth straight American League victory with a 12-4 win over Boston at Fenway Park.

In the only other day game played in the majors, Minnesota Twins unleashed a 15-hit attack that featured two grand slam home runs — a major league record — as they mauled Cleveland Indians 14-3.

Pittsburgh's scheduled twin-bill at New York in the National League was postponed by rain.

At Boston, the league-leading Yanks got their second complete pitching performance in as many games when rookie right-hander Jim Bouton turned back the Red Sox on 11 scattered hits.

Ralph Terry had allowed only four hits in New York's 1-0 triumph here Tuesday night.

Mantle's 18th homer of the well's home run and put the game on ice with a pair in the fifth and two more in the sixth. Joe Goode started for the Lions and was tagged for eight of the runs and nine of the hits. Monty Montell finished up allowing five hits and four runs. He also recorded the only strike-out of the game.

Centerfielder Red Mitchell knocked in three runs with a triple and two singles and Maurice Fitzpatrick had a double and single. Hubie Morrison and John Hughes each chipped in with two singles.

Frank Ball called the balls and strikes with Zimer Ward and Vern Blanchard on the bases.

Bill Monbouquette was the Boston starter but failed to last the opening inning.

At Minneapolis, Bob Allison and Harmon Killebrew slammed the bases-loaded homers in an 11-run first inning explosion that enabled left hander Dick Stigman, making his first start for the Twins after 25 relief appearances, to coast to victory.

The Twins sent 14 batters to the plate in the first inning and seven of them collected hits, including home runs by Allison, Killebrew and Earl Batley.

Allison up for second time finally ended the inning by popping to the shortstop.

Killebrew added his second homer of the game with none on in the third.

Night action in the American had Detroit at Los Angeles, Baltimore at Kansas City and Washington at Chicago.

In the National night schedule had Los Angeles at Cincinnati, Chicago at St. Louis and Philadelphia at Houston.
