Canada Packers Ltd. Changes Are Announced

Following the annual meeting held at Toronto on August 11th, important changes in the direction of Canada Packers Limited were announced. J. S. McLean, President since Canada Packers' inception in 1927, becomes Chairman of the Board, his son William F. McLean, formerly a Vice-President, has been appointed Treasurer, and G. A. Schell, formerly Vice-President and Assistant to the President, becomes Executive Vice-President.

Two new directors were elected, Kenneth S. Harris and W. W. Lashby. John D. A. Evans was appointed Secretary and Assistant Treasurer of the Company. Kenneth Harris is a son of the late James Harris, and nephew of the late W. T. Harris. James Harris, W. T. Harris, and J. S. McLean were formerly officers of the late Harris Abattoir Company and were co-founders of Canada Packers Limited.

The following officers were re-elected: N. J. McLean, Vice-President and General Manager, S. G. Bennett, Vice-President, A. J. E. Child, Vice-President and Treasurer, and W. R. Carroll, Vice-President and Assistant General Manager.

Big Drop In July Potato Shipments

A definite falling off in the number of carloads of potatoes shipped last month is noted in the monthly report issued by the office of Superintendent C. T. Montgomery, Canadian National Railways.

Potato shipments in July declined to 36 cars from the 92 ferried on the Borden to Cape Tormentine route the same month in 1953. However, the total carloads exported was almost the same with 336 being shipped in July of this year and 342 last year. The imports also were about equal to the figures for last year when from Cape Tormentine, there were brought over 1,002 carloads. Last month there were 89 head of livestock moved from here by rail, compared to the 71 of last year. Canned goods declined from 18 to 11 carloads, but roughwood showed a great increase with the 41 carloads shipped compared to the 5 of July last year. Lumber fell off from 13 cars to two.

On the import side one of the more noticeable increases was in sand, stone and gravel with 80 carloads arriving in August, the 40 of the same month a year ago.

Miscellaneous carload shipments also dropped far below those of July 1953 when the total was 196. But to help offset this there were 44 cars of brick and cement this July while none at all were brought in last year.

Of the 1,092 carloads brought here last month 977 were consigned to points between Borden, Summerside and Charlottetown; 72 to points east and south of Charlottetown, and the balance of 43 cars to points west of Summerside.

The export traffic saw 247 carloads originating at points between Charlottetown, Summerside and Borden; 26 at points east and south of Charlottetown; and 63 moving from sources west of Summerside.

MONTREAL (CP)—The U. S. dollar Thursday closed at a count of 3-13 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, unchanged. It took 96 31-32 cents Canadian to buy \$1 American. Pound sterling \$2.73, unchanged.

New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market encountered some rough going Thursday but emerged with only moderate losses on reduced volume.

Manufacturers, steels, railroads, radio-televisions, motors and utilities were lower.

Pollanabee Steel, which accepted an offer to sell its assets for \$9,000,000, was a feature of trading. The stock closed Wednesday at 2 1/2, hit a high Thursday of 2 3/4, low of 2 1/4 and closed at 2 1/4 off 1/4.

Curtis-Wright was the day's most active issue off 1/4 at 13 1/4 on 41,100 shares. It was followed by Boeing off 1/4 at 64 1/4 and Mengel up 1/4 at 21.

Among stocks declining were Bethlehem Steel, General Motors, Grumman Aircraft, Douglas Aircraft, Radio Corp., American Telephone.

Western Union, International Paper, New York Central, and Johnson & Johnson were higher.

Higher were Goodyear, Inspiration Copper, W. R. Grace, E. W. Bliss, Northrop, Bell Aircraft, Kern County Land and General Dynamics.

Studebaker, whose workers voted to take a pay cut to keep the company going competitively, was quietly lower a day and closed unchanged at 17 1/4.

Canadian stocks were lower.

Dome Mines and International Nickel both fell 1/4 and Canadian Pacific lost 1/4. Distillers Seagram advanced 1/4.

Among Canadian issues on the American stock exchange included Lake Shore and Royalite Oil, down 1/4 and 1/2 respectively.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP)—The stock market leaned forward irregularly in active trading Thursday.

Dominion Tar and Canadian Cellulose were each up 1/4 points at 10 1/4 and 21, respectively. Consolidated Paper at 56 1/2 was 1/2 better. Vickers advanced 1/4 at 30 1/4 and National Steel Car at 25 1/4 was up 1/4 point. Half-point gains were chalked up by Powell River at 36 1/4, Power Corporation at 45 1/4 and Canada Steamship at 25 1/4.

Asbestos, Shawinigan, Aluminium, Consolidated Smelters and McColl improved minor fractions.

General Dynamics lost 1/4 at 67 while Hudson Bay Mining at 48 and Industrial Acceptance at 46 were each 1/2 point easier. Other lower issues were Foundation, International Nickel, Walker, Canadian Car and CPR.

Miscellaneous industrials, papers, senior oils and banks gained strength while beverages and steels showed little change. A mixed tone ruled the utility, senior metal and carrier sections.

Mines were mixed in a narrow range. East Sullivan increased 25 cents at \$4.10 while Algom at \$7.85 was down the same amount. Western oils were mainly steady in quiet dealings.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP)—Mixed prices for mining stocks were recorded on the Toronto stock market Thursday. Trading was the heaviest in senior base metals and golds were narrowly ahead but junior base metals, western oils and uranium closed slightly down.

Western oil losses narrowly outnumbered gains at the close. A fifteen-cent drop by Peace River was about the biggest price change.

Senior base metals gained peace and minor fractions. Junior
