

Pirates' Fielder Belts Them All

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Memo to pitchers: Throw to Roberto Clemente outside, inside, high or low—then duck. "I always try to go with the pitch," says Pittsburgh Pirates' star right fielder. He succeeds often enough to be in a strong position to capture his second National League batting title in four seasons. Clemente is hitting .341 and has a good shot at the 200-hit mark with 176. In 1961, the year he won the batting crown with .351, he collected 201 safeties.

This also likely will be the fifth straight year he will have topped the .300 mark. Clemente, a right-handed batter who steps away from the plate with his left foot when he swings, is noted for his ability to hit to right field. "It's best to hit to right field in this park (Forbes Field) because of the wall," he said. The curving wall allows many balls hit against it to roll or bounce by the fielder for extra bases.

Game time for this afternoon's tilt is set for 1:30 and if third game is necessary it will be played immediately following the first game.

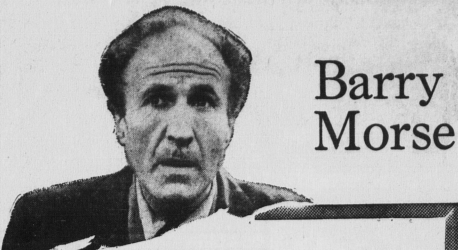
