Chevrefils' goal-mouth slap of a shot by Fernie Flaman came just 28 seconds after Jack McIntyre had scored his second goal to tie the score 2-2.

The shot also frustrated a brilliant goal-tending job by the Black Hawks' Al Rollins, who made a staggering 40 saves.

U. S. Photographer Missing In Hungary

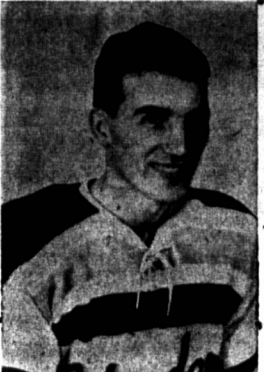

Canada's Uranium Supply Ample For Home, Export

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada Thursday made it clear that this country has an abundance of uranium ore for its atomic power program and huge amounts for export to waste in countries lacking their own supplies.

Officials here believe that if all Western countries release figures on uranium reserves it will come as a surprise to Russia. They also say present western reserves are sufficient to satisfy the needs of all atomic power programs likely to be undertaken for the next 50 years.

Canada at present exports uranium in the form of an oxide only to the U.S., but is expected to ship ore, oxide and later uranium metal to Britain, Japan and other western countries without uranium supplies.
