LAST MOVES IN SOUTH AFRICA

Gen. De Wet Crosses The Vaal

KITCHENER IN PURSUIT — METHUEN CO-OPERATING.

Capture of a British Garrison by The Boers.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

LONDON, August 9.—Lord Roberts fears that Elands River garrison has been captured after ten days' resistance.

The War Office has received from him the following despatch:

"PRATORIA, August 7.—DeLarey, hearing of Ian Hamilton's approach towards Rustenburg, and seeing that he had no chance of capturing Baden-Powell, hurried off to Elands River. Hamilton reported that firing in Elands River ceased yesterday and that Lieut.-Colonel Hoar and the garrison had evidently been captured.

"Hamilton left Rustenburg this morning bringing Baden-Powell's force with him. "General De Wet commenced crossing the Vaal River yesterday.

"Lord Kitchener is now moving in pursuit.

"Lord Methuen on the right bank of the Vaal has evidently come into contact with DeWet's advance guard, as his guns were heard by Kitchener this morning."

Ambassadors Changed.

LONDON, Aug. 8.—In consequence of the retirement of the Right Hon. Sir Horace Rumbold from his post as British ambassador at Vienna and the retirement of the Right Hon. Sir Henry Drummond Wolff, the British ambassador at Madrid the Hon. Sir Francis Charles Plunkett who has been British minister at Brussels since 1893 has been appointed British ambassador at Vienna, and Sir Henry Morimer Durand, British minister and consul general at Teheran, Persia, has been appointed British ambassador at Madrid. Edmund Constantine Phipps, the British minister at Rio de Janeiro, is transferred to Brussels, and Sir Henry Nevill Dering, British minister to Mexico, has been transferred to Rio de Janeiro.

Success For Canada!

OTTAWA, Aug 7.—The Department of Agriculture received advices in Paris today that Canada has been awarded the grand prize for cheese, butter and eggs in cold storage at the exposition. The cold storage show case and its contents continue to attract great attention from commercial men to the possibility of enlarging the export trade of Canada in all classes of perishable food products. The latest shipments of apples from Canada, arrived at Paris in fine condition. Most of the packages out from Grimsby, Ontario, contained on their arrival from 75 to 95 per cent of perfect specimens. There were also samples of Fameuse of last year's crop in perfect condition in Paris on July 18. Other varieties which had kept particularly well were cases of American Pippin, Baldwin, Golden Russet, Ben Davis, Newman C P P E, Waukegan, Canada Red Man, and Northern Spy.

Story of Sunday's Fight.

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—A despatch, dated at the camp of the allies, Pei Tsang, is printed here. Some new facts appear as follows:

The expedition moved slowly because it was found that the Chinese had placed mines and torpedoes in the Pei river. The Japanese in the advance soon struck a force of the enemy near Tien Tsin and a skirmish followed. The Chinese fought well and the Japanese suffered a loss of twelve men. The Chinese then retired upon Pei Tsang. Scouts reported three large guns and many smaller cannon were in place in the Chinese trenches at Pei Tsang. A spy, who had gone out in advance of the allies, brought in the information that the Chinese forces consisted of fully 40,000 men, well armed and strongly entrenched. The American and British troops marched up the west bank of the river. The Russians and Japanese moved along the east banks. Light draught transport boats, with supplies and artillery, moved slowly up the river between the columns. The weather was ideal and the troops were in good condition and high fighting spirits. Pei Tsang was reached Saturday and the allies took position for battle during the night. The attack was made Sunday at daylight. The resistance of the Chinese were most stubborn. For seven hours the result of the battle was in doubt. Then the allied troops rushed the Chinese position and the Mongolians were driven from their trenches. The American troops did splendid execution, fighting most gallantly. The losses of the allies were heavy.

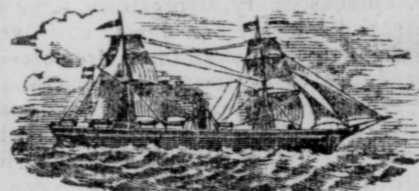

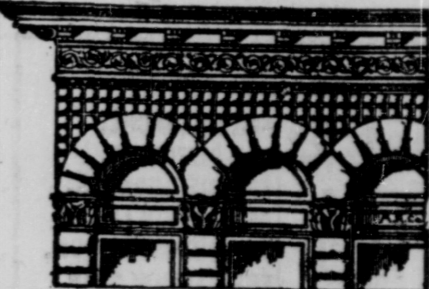
