Failure and Crime.

The firm of Ekerdoff & Co., wholesale grocers and importers of Montreal has failed with liabilities of \$55,000. The Bank of British North America holds a large amount of the firm's papers under discount, which is turning out to be forged, and criminal warrants have been issued against the senior and junior members of the firm. Ekerdoff has absconded to the States, but John A. Dyde gave himself up, and repudiated any knowledge of the forgeries, the finances being exclusively in the hands of the senior partner, who is a German, and came to Montreal five years ago. A portion of the liabilities are due in England and the remainder to firms in Montreal and New York. Dyde belongs to a high family, his father being aide de camp to the Queen for military services performed in Canada. 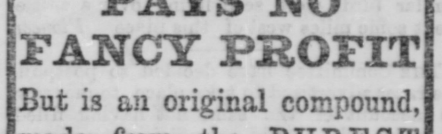
