LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

HIGHLAND GAMES.—In the Highland Games at Antigonish, D. Clarke, of Grand River, won first prize for heavy hammer throwing, his best throw being 96 feet 8 inches. J. McDonald was second with a throw of 82 feet. D. Clarke also won in the light hammer competition, covering 116 feet 5 inches. In putting the heavy shot H. Gillis was first with a throw of 37 feet 4 inches, and D. Clarke second with 37 feet 3 inches. Putting light stone: first J. McDonald 44 feet 2 inches; second D. Clarke 43 feet 6 inches.

KENSINGTON.—The Kensington cheese factory is being enlarged, the addition being 20x17 feet, and a larger engine will be put in. The cheese output this year is expected to more than double that of last year. This is a pleasing evidence of progress, and shows that the Kensington farmers believe in making the most of their special advantages in dairying. This example is well worthy of imitation in many sections, where the farmers have not yet awakened to the possibilities of the great dairying industry.—Agriculturist.

MUSICAL CONCERT.—The choir of the Charlottetown Baptist Church treated the people of Cornwall to a musical concert on Friday evening that was much appreciated by all who attended. The program consisted of anthems, solos and several readings by the Misses Josie and May Stentford. The soloists were Misses B. Nicholson, Marion McKay, Marion Earle, and Mr. Cecil McNeil. Misses Amy Earle and Ella Steavenson were the accompanists. After a choice lunch prepared by the ladies at the house of Mr. Armas Hyde, the choir returned to the city.

A NARROW ESCAPE.—What came very near being another fatal accident occurred on Ferry wharf Saturday evening. An elderly man with a horse and cart drove one of the wheels on the sidewalk. The weight was too great and the wheel partially broke through, throwing the man to the ground. The horse became frightened but the driver held on to the reins. In the struggle he fell behind the cart and the reins being very tight the horse started to move backwards. Two young men who saw the accident and rushed to the rescue, arrived just in time to drag the man away. Had they been a second or two later the cart wheel would have passed directly over his neck, with it is probable, fatal results. They did not recognize the man who was evidently intoxicated.—Guardian.

THE CRUISER OSPREY.
 She Arrived in Charlottetown on Saturday Afternoon—A Handsome Craft Well Officered.

On Saturday the Dominion Government Cruiser Osprey came into port. This vessel was launched at Shelburne, N. S., last autumn, the christening ceremony being performed by Lady Davies. The Osprey is a schooner of 124 tons, built after the McLean model. Her rig is decidedly hand-ome, and she spreads a total sail area of 2,700 yards. The length of the hull is 125 feet; from tip of bowsprit to end of mainboom the measurement is 175 feet. The mainboom is 72 feet long, her extreme beam is 25½ feet; draft 13½ feet; and she can sail 14 knots. The cruiser looks well under sail, and presented a fine appearance as she came in on Saturday. The Osprey is commanded by Capt. Knowlton. The first officer is Lucas Aker, and she carries a gunner, boat-swain, and twenty-two men besides. By invitation of Commander Spain, who is making the present cruise in the Osprey, one of our staff visited the cruiser and found the good impression, received from a distant examination, confirmed by stepping on board. Everything is in first-class order, the wood and metal work scrupulously clean, and ropes neatly coiled. The men are well disciplined and well set up, mostly clean shaven, and look exactly like the Jack Tars of the Royal Navy. The cruiser is fitted up splendidly, comfortable accommodation being provided for officers and men. One is struck by the extreme cleanliness; and the beauty of the model and evident superiority of the vessel indicate that the pride which the Captain plainly feels for his vessel is deserved. The Osprey's armament consists of a handsome brass cannon which is as much for ornament as for use. In the armory is a stand of muskets, cutlasses and revolvers, in case of trouble when enforcing the Fisheries Regulations. Captain Knowlton is a well known "cruiser" but it is pleasant to add that so far his captures have been made peaceably. He is a fine, hearty sailor and his vessel is a credit to him.

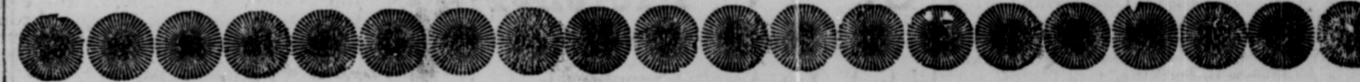
