money winning pacers. The colt was found dead in the pasture, supposedly struck by lightning the night before. A yearling full brother brought \$10,000 at auction last fall and because of the scarcity of the get of Scotland this one, had it reached the same age, would probably have brought more money.

Cancanners, winner of the Prix d'Amerique in Paris this year and that recently won the Italian Free For All Trot, is being entered for the two-mile trot at Roosevelt Raceway which will be held later in the season. If she starts — and the expectations are that she will — it will be the first time a French champion trotter has ever competed against the best of the American breed in the United States.

The early closing events to be raced at the Charlottetown Driving Park and Provincial Exhibition Association commencing on Friday night, July 4 and continuing until Saturday night, August 2, have drawn total entries of 129 in ten events — certainly a surprisingly strong showing for so early in the season. The largest entry is in the 2:25 pace which has 23, and next is the 2:19 pace with 20. Two of the events had less than the minimum of ten, but the Association opened these and closed them again and will race them in two dashes with no further payment, which is certainly very generous.
