Savings Bond

Drive Continues To Gain Momentum

OTTAWA, (CP) - The Canada savings bond drive continues to gain momentum, with total sales rising to \$287,489,000 in the first two and a half weeks of the current campaign, the Bank of Canada reported Thursday. The campaign opened Oct. 19.

Total sales have jumped by more than \$130,000,000 from \$154,682,000 in the similar 1952 period, with the number of buyers swelling to 697,327 from 505,739 last year.

Payroll sales by regions: British Columbia \$7,107,000; Prairies \$6,722,000; Ontario \$85,374,000; Quebec \$34,985,000; Maritimes \$3,874,000.

Canadian Process May Cut Steel Output Costs

By Joe Bradis PITTSBURGH, (AP) - Steel companies hunting ways to produce more steel at lower costs may find the answer in an improved electrical method developed in Canada. At least one big Pittsburgh utility hopes to sell them on the idea of using electricity. Electric induction heating has been common practice for many years but until recently such heating was confined to small jobs or surface hardening and finishing.

Dominion Asbestos Mines Suspended From Trading

TORONTO, (CP) - Dominion Asbestos Mines, Ltd., was suspended from trading Thursday on the Toronto stock exchange. The exchange said the action followed filing in bankruptcy court in Montreal of a petition for a receiving order against the company. The company's shares sold on the Toronto stock exchange at \$4.25 in January. Today they opened at 62 cents and were trading at 43 cents on a turnover of 341,000 shares at suspension time. The company, incorporated in Quebec in 1950, holds 755 acres near Asbestos, Que., and development work has been proceeding.

Canada As Seen In Russian Encyclopedia

MOSCOW, (Reuters) - The Great Soviet Encyclopedia, in a 16-page section on Canada, says the rights of Canadian citizens are "grossly broken by police repression directed mainly against workers and progressives." The latest volume of the encyclopedia, 19th of a 60-volume series, contains this description: "Included in the British Empire, Canada is in fact in considerably greater dependence on the monopolists of the United States. The system of government reproduces the most reactionary features of the state order of the United States and England. The Canadian Senate is a most reactionary institution consisting of representatives of big capital. Election rights are based on racial, religious and property discrimination. "Very often most important state decisions are taken by the Canadian prime minister and cabinet without prior consultation with the House of Commons, which later gives them formal sanction. Ten photographs of Canadian scenes published in the encyclopedia include a slum scene in Quebec, with washing hanging on the line in a narrow alley between back-to-back houses, and a queue of unemployed said to be waiting for food relief in Toronto in 1952. The sign on the building says: "Scott Mission."

New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP) - The stock market's strongest recovery movement of the year went through its seventh straight week last week with unabated power. Gains in prices were not startling, but they were generous. Volume expanded to the highest daily average level since the drive ahead from the low of the year in mid-September. The week was somewhat in the nature of a test. It was in mid-August that the stock market started its tumble toward a low for the year in mid-September. The recovery drive has been going ahead since then. The week started with the market on average in the neighborhood of those August peaks. The question was whether that would prove to be a barrier to further progress. It wasn't. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained \$1.10 this week. It was up 30 cents last week. It now stands at \$108.40. That is \$1.10 under the highest level reached in August, which was the peak of the short summer rally. As things stand now, the stock market is just about out of the woods.

Canadians Mixed

The five most active issues last week on the New York stock exchange were: Lehigh Coal and Navigation up 1/2 at 9 1/2 with 107,200 shares traded, Celanese Corp. up 2 at 22, Merritt-Chapman and Scott up 1 1/2 at 30 1/2, Mack Trucks up 1/2 at 15 1/2, and American Telephone up 1/2 at 15 1/2.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP) - Steel production went down again last week, but Steel magazine predicts today the market soon will perk up. The metal-working weekly bases its prediction on the price of scrap, usually an accurate indication of how the steel market will go. Scrap prices have strengthened for five straight weeks, and the magazine's composite on steel-making grades is now \$35 a gross ton. The composite was \$44.17 last August before the price started a plunge that halted at \$31.50 five weeks ago. Steel plants eased off production another half point last week to 93.5 per cent of rated capacity as the industry made further adjustments for the market. Demand for the various forms of finished steel was mixed. In plentiful supply were wire, tin plate, hot rolled and cold-rolled carbon strip, pipe and most alloys. Cold-rolled carbon steel sheets were in strong demand, and many manufacturers of this product expect to have a two-week carryover of unfilled orders going into the first quarter of next year. In contrast demand for hot-rolled carbon steel sheets was easing.

FINE CATCHES HALIFAX, (CP) - Official reports show 6,400 Atlantic salmon were caught in Nova Scotia rivers last season, or 1,378 more than a year ago. The season's biggest fish was a 31-pounder taken from the St. Mary's River on the eastern shore. JOINT EFFORT ST. STEPHEN, N. B. (CP) - Fire departments of both St. Stephen and of Calais across the international border responded when fire damaged a grocery store. The combined effort kept damages down to about \$2,000.
