The "Folger boom" is said to be growing rapidly in N.W. York.

Diphtheria is prevalent in Wolfville, N.S. The public schools have been closed for a fortnight.

Two thousand dollars worth of smuggled American jewelry was seized in Montreal a few days ago by the customs officers.

It is reported that the Porte is much alarmed at the decision of the British Government to send Lord Dufferin to Egypt.

Toronto customs returns for October show an increase of \$2,853 over October of last year. Ottawa shows an increase of nearly sixty per cent.

The new telescope has arrived at the Toronto observatory and will be placed in position. It was made in Oxford, England. The price of the instrument was \$2,000.

The Anarchists are pushing their agitation in France with alarming vigour and persistency. Revolutionary placards have been posted in St. Sulpice, calling upon the people to commit acts of violence against the "slave-driving Bourgeoisie."

The papers announce the death of Mr. Daniel H. Fowler, a journalist well known in Halifax, and late Shipping Editor of the New York Journal of Commerce. Mr. Fowler was unting in his work, and possessed many good qualities and warm personal friends.
