

In my last letter I called attention to the fact, that numbers of our best young men annually leave the Island and embark in American vessels to fish on our own coasts...

There can be no doubt that by doing so we would be conferring a great benefit on the Island generally. The fisheries are the only resource we now have to fall back upon.

There can be no doubt that the British Government will send some ships-of-war into the Gulf on the expiration of the Reciprocity Treaty, to protect their interests...

If a bounty of four shillings per barrel on Mackerel, and two shillings per quintal on Codfish were given for the quantity exported, or otherwise, a bounty of twenty shillings per ton to all vessels suitable for the business...

"But we will have no bounties or class legislation here," exclaim some of our old politicians. Not so fast, my superficial friend. What have your best and most popular actions during all your political career been but class legislation?

I said in my last letter that the policy of our present Government was to discourage the fisherman by every means in their power, and I am led to that belief by knowing that some fifteen or twenty years since, goods for the use of the fisheries came in either free of duty, or at a low rate, and a liberal bounty was then given to those who embarked in the fishery...

I feel assured that if some such Legislative encouragement as above stated were given we should, at the very least, have fifty Island vessels prosecuting the mackerel fishery alone during the coming season...
