# Fine Vegetable Display At The Harvest Festival

A display of vegetables that has artistry, as well as quality of product, is one of the feature attractions in the display of vegetables, roots and field crops at the Harvest Festival and Rural Youth Fair at the Provincial Exhibition Grounds. The class calls for a collection of garden vegetables. There are a number of them but three stand out impressively because of the attractive manner in which they are displayed, as well as the number and the variety of vegetables in the collection.

The judges, Dave Schurman and Gordon Warren, were delighted with the displays and deliberated for sometime before giving the nod for first place to Parker Jewell of York. Vessey Seeds was a close second and M.G. Foster of York a close third. All are outstanding.

Another exhibit that caught the eye of the judges was the collection of pickling cucumbers by Raymond Vessey of York. It was good enough to earn a pencilled comment by the judges stating that it was "almost perfect" and congratulating him on "growing and selecting" it.

**SEED POTATOES**  
The Coffin twins from Fortune and Fred Frank, who were grand champions in seed potatoes with their first prize display of Katahdins. They had the grand championship in table stock a year ago.

The reserve grand in seed went to John Aitken of Fortune Bridge with his Pontiacs.

John Henry L. MacLaren said that the quality is ahead of last year, and there are no poor entries this year he said.

The grand championship in tablestock potatoes went this year to Anselm MacDonald of Kennecott. The first prize winners in the class for intermediate or late varieties.

The reserve grand in tablestock went to Howard Dixon of Fortune with his Irish Cobblers, the winners in the class for early varieties. Mr. Dixon and his brother had the grand for seed last year.

Other potato winners yesterday were the Coffin brothers for any other variety (white) and Raymond Vessey York for Green Mountains.

1944-1950 he was with British United Press as manager at Moncton, Halifax, Toronto and Winnipeg.

Mr. Fraser started his newspaper career with the Charlottetown Guardian and later worked with the Patriot. During the War, he was for a short time, field representative with the Wartime Prices and Trade Board.

During the six years that Mr. Fraser was in the employ of the Island Government, he saw the tourist traffic increase by 50 per cent. He re-organized the Travel Bureau and his efforts were culminated with the acquisition of the present bureau which is one of the finest in Canada.

He instituted a systematic advertising program and completely rewrote and created new literature which has done much to make the province better and more attractively known in other parts of the World.

George Fraser took a prominent part in establishing a Maritime Co-operative Tourist advertising program and acted as co-ordinator for this important promotion scheme.

During his service with the Provincial Government, Mr. Fraser brought about such changes as simplified highway route numbers; instituted the roadside table policy and started a voluntary fishing guide service.

He created the Prince Edward Island permanent convention bureau; he suggested the name Lord Selkirk for the Wood Islands - Caribou Ferry and pioneered the new joint N.B.-P.E.I. bureau which is being built at Aulac, N.B.
