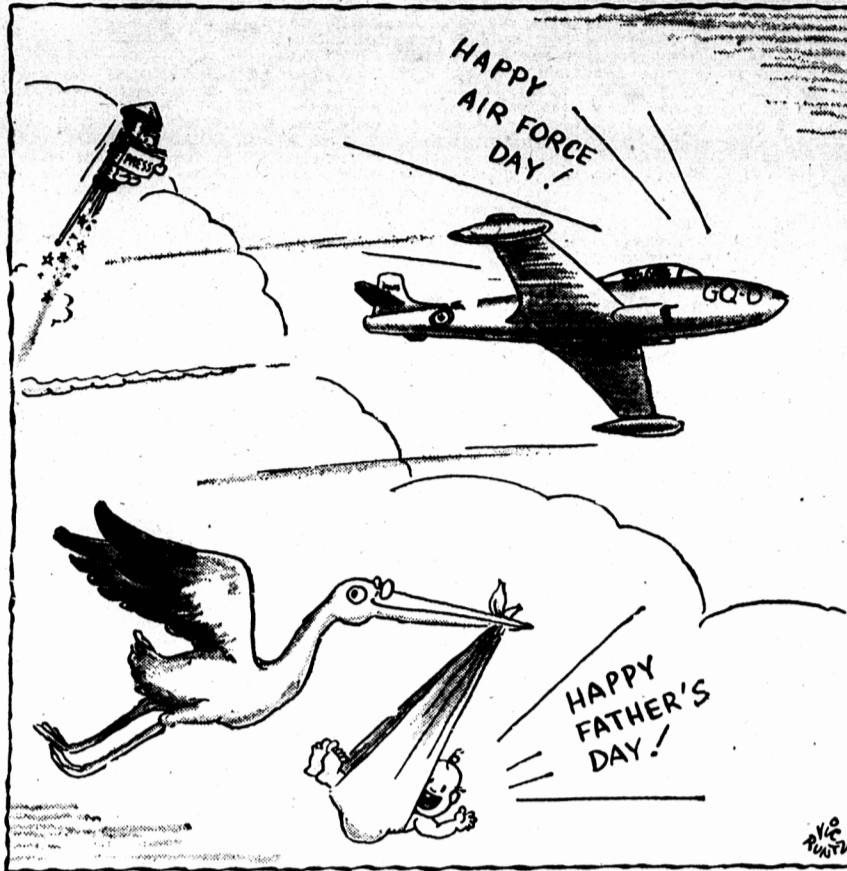

WINNIPEG, June 13—(CP)—Coarse grain futures prices generally moved narrowly in dull trading today at the close on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. There was evidence today of more export purchases in barley and some shipping demand appeared in oats. Trade reports indicated the sale of five cargoes of Canadian barley for export in the last five days, three for Japan and two for Austria. There was no information available on overnight loadings of Canadian wheat for export. Prices of class two and I. W. A. wheat were down 1-8 cent.

MONTREAL, June 13—(CP)—The United States dollar today closed at a discount of 2 3/32 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 1/16 from yesterday's close. That is, it took \$0.97 29/32 Canadian to buy \$1 American. The pound sterling was \$2.72 5/16, down 5/16 from Thursday.
