Yes--there's plenty amiss in the Student Union but there's even more amiss in the

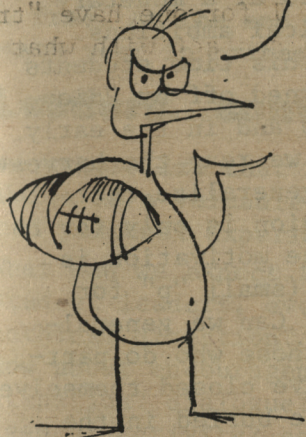

Have you enjoyed seeing these people raked over the coals? Well you're worse than that--rest assured that anything I've said about this executive goes doubly for you.

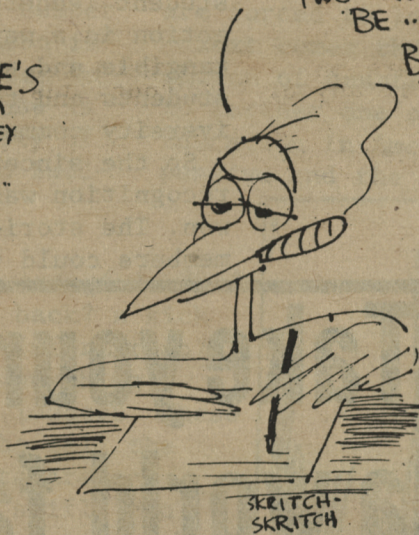

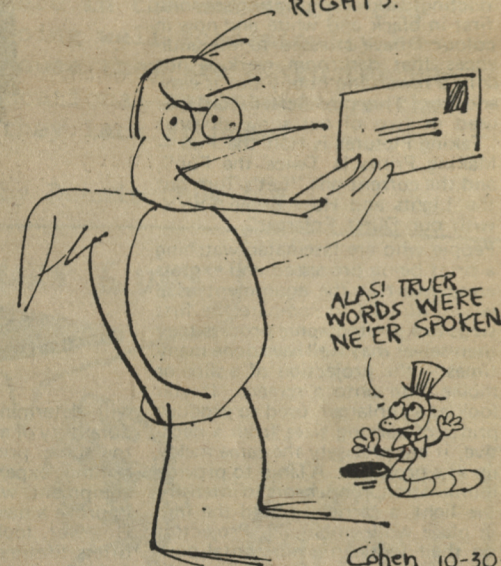
