

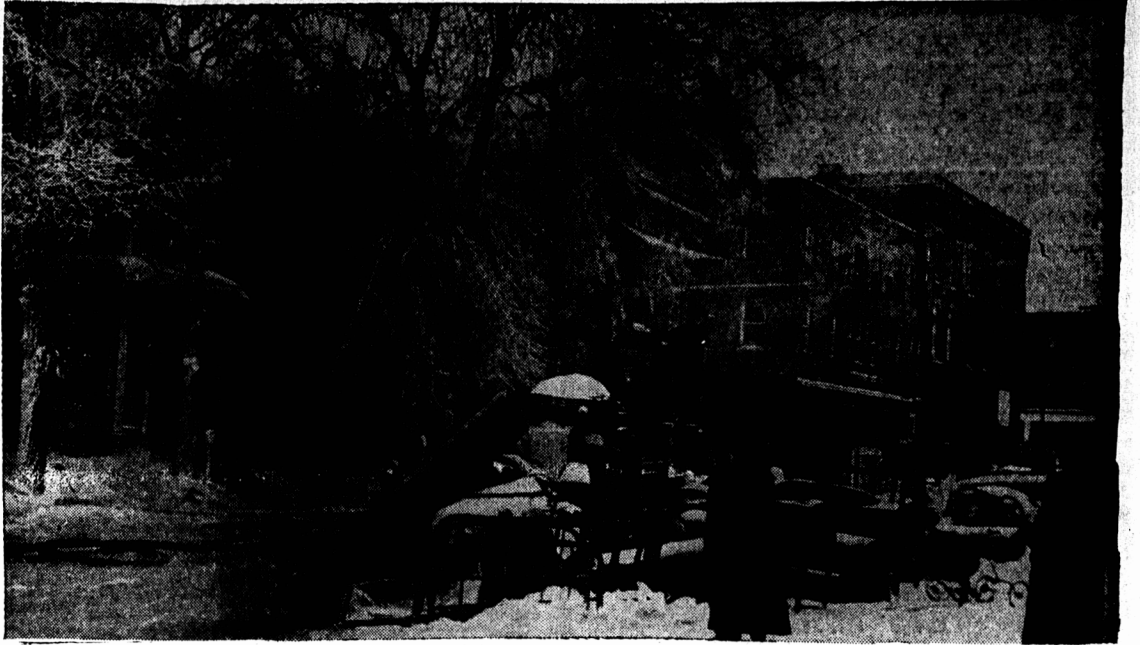

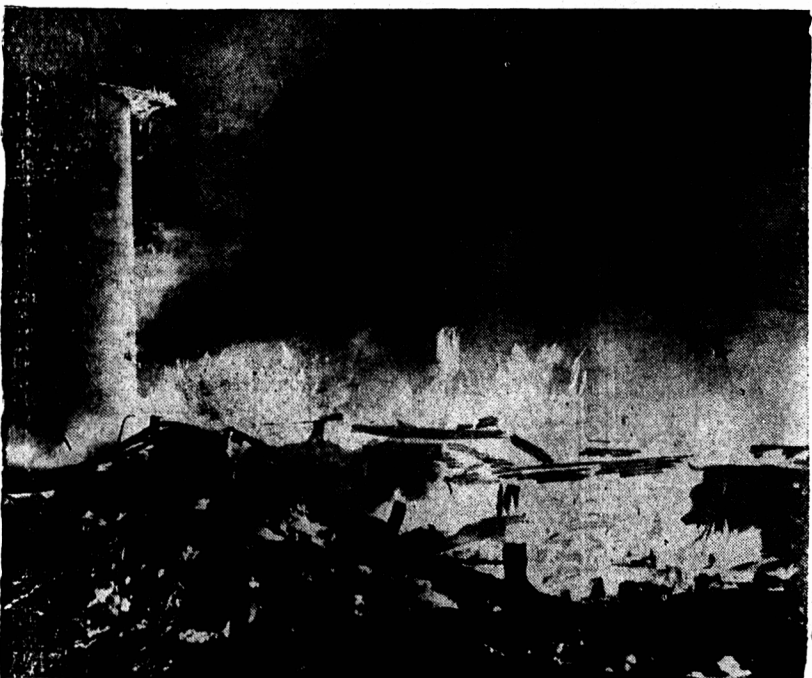

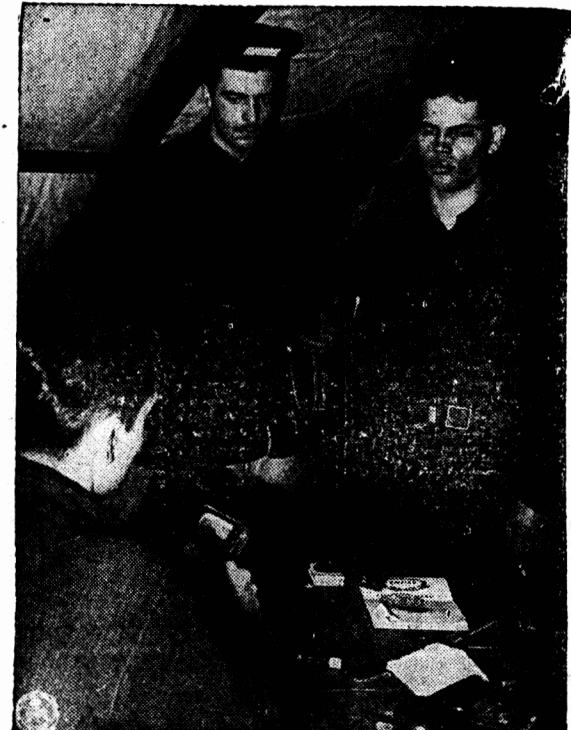
Covered with ice at \$35,000 fire in Lindsay, Ont., is this chilled fireman.



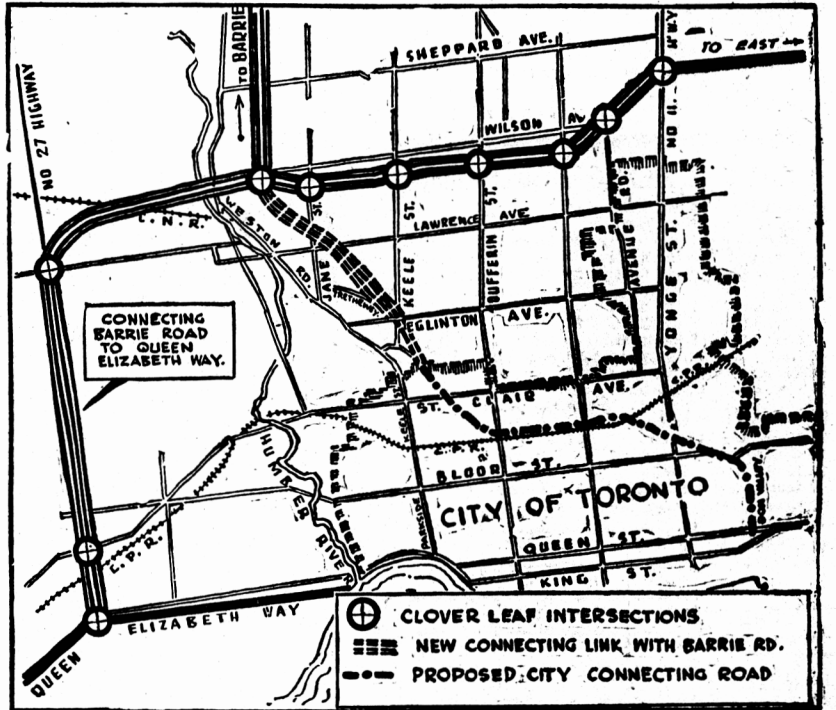
Homeless after fire at Lindsay which destroyed a terrace of three dwellings, are these people and their belongings. Thirty persons were affected. Firemen fought blaze for five hours. One boarder, George Fanning, lost \$200 which was tucked away in a trunk. Fire started in cellar of one of the tenants, Jack Allan, one of the Lindsay firemen.



Total damage reached \$40,000 at this fire on the farm of Leon Hallewyn, half-mile south of Waterford, Ont. Destroyed were: nine tons of tobacco, all the farm machinery, car, tractor, two pigs, 10 tons of hay, similar amount of straw.
