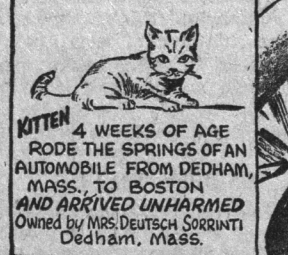

repeated it. This time the finesse Spring, Md., ducked. The finesse lost. Karpin returned a diamond and South now had to lose a heart trick and go down one.

Karpin's defense was of course correct. Defensive strategy includes the principle that things should be made as tough as possible for declarer. To win the first club lead is the equivalent of giving up. The refusal to win the club immediately might have cost Karpin a trick, but it was a small investment to make to protect the slam.

We think South was too glib. The setup was such as to invite suspicion when the first club finesse worked. East was pretty well bound to play a low club whether he had the king or not.

Opening lead—ace of diamonds.

This hand occurred many years ago in the Vanderbilt team of four event. At both tables the final contract was six spades.

At one table the play went very smoothly. South ruffed the diamond lead, drew four rounds of trumps, and finessed a club. East von returned a heart, and declarer laid off the balance, having tricks to burn.

But at the other table the play varied. Declarer ruffed the diamond, drew trumps, led the ten of clubs, and finessed. East, Fred Karpin, of Silver having been successful, declarer

Urges Canada Establish Claim Firmly To Her Arctic Regions

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada must firmly establish its claim to its Arctic territory in view of Russian and American interest in this rich, undeveloped area, Opposition Leader Pearson said Thursday.

He told the Commons this best could be done through discovery and effective occupation, preferably by Canadian civilians.

Canada's claim to the Arctic should be strengthened so it cannot be challenged by other nations which might wish to exploit mineral resources.

Speaking during consideration of the northern affairs department's spending program, Mr. Pearson said the Soviet Union is making major strides in Arctic development. It even was making use of "moving ice fields within what might be called the Canadian sector."

U.S. HAS INTEREST

The United States also was interested in Arctic development and has been responsible for considerable work, much of it in the Canadian area. Some American writers referred to this Canadian

territory as "our Arctic."

"It becomes more important than ever before that there be no doubt left in the mind of anybody that it is the Canadian Arctic," he said.

Mr. Pearson said the voyage of two American submarines under the Arctic ice opens up a new field of Arctic development.

The Arctic was rich in minerals and oil but it was another thing to exploit them economically and deliver them to the markets of the world. However, this might be done by moving oil and minerals to submarine ports where they could be shipped by atomic power.

"This may seem to be a pretty remote vision but I know that visions do not 'intimidate' the government, he said.

Referring to U.S. defence installation in Canada, he said the objective should be for Canada to take them over as soon as possible.

He urged an exchange of visits by Canadian and Soviet scientists on northern research and development.

Ont. Minister Refuses To Support School Television

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont. (CP)—Cries of indignation were heard at the Canadian Teachers' Federation annual conference Wednesday when Secretary-Treasurer George Croskery of Ottawa told delegates Education Minister Dunlop of Ontario refused to support national school television programs.

He said the CBC tried out telecasts on the provincial level in Manitoba and on a regional basis at Halifax, then asked the federation what support could be expected from provincial education departments.

"Letters were written to the various ministers asking what moral support they would give to the plan at no expense to the provinces. The answers were astounding."

Mr. Dunlop refused to support the programs because he believes they deviate from the three Rs, said Mr. Croskery. Two other provinces also refused support to the CBC undertaking because they thought it constituted an invasion of provincial rights, he said.

"This is a serious and shocking situation."

"The CBC, if it had had indications of support from departments of education, was ready to inaugurate a series of national school telecasts, much like the national ones," he said.

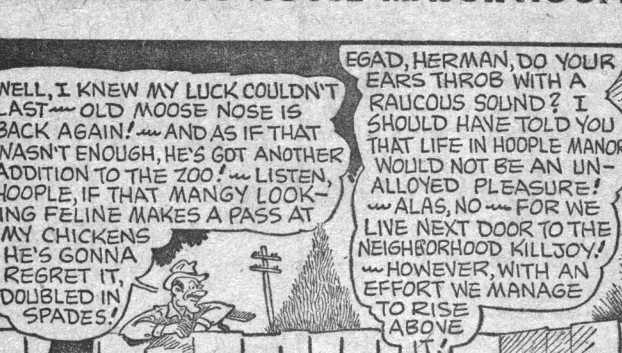
