Coal Strike In U. S. Possible Next Month

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22—(AP)—John L. Lewis has cleared the way for a possible country-wide coal strike at the end of next month.

The United Mine Workers leader, it was disclosed today, formally notified the Federal Mediation Service that a dispute exists in the coal fields—a step that must be taken, under the Taft-Hartley Labor Act, at least 30 days before a strike can begin.

The way is still open for the government to seek an 80-day no-strike injunction under Taft-Hartley if Lewis decides to call the miners out.

U. M. W. contracts with both hard and soft coal operators expire at the end of August and the union has a traditional policy of "no contract, no work."

Lewis' notification to the Mediation Service came a few hours before the start of a U.M.W.-ordered "memorial" holiday which will close most U.S. mines for the five works days next week.

Will Speed Up Long Distance Phone Services

William Logan, equipment engineer from the Maritime Telephone and Telegraph Co., Halifax office, is at present engaged in rounding out the necessary connections to make the repeater station at Egmont Bay a going concern. This installation provides for a speeding up of the long distance telephone service between Charlottetown and Summerside, as well as to and from points on the mainland. The New Brunswick contact will be at Lutes Hill, near Moncton. The wire installation at Egmont Bay has been completed, along with the three miles of wire necessary for the carriers to Wellington, where the installation hits the trunk wire pole lines to both Summerside and Charlottetown.

Although the radio and carrier equipment has not been completed, it is expected that line tests will be made today, and that the installation throughout will be in full operation within a month.

Twelve two-way talking circuits will operate on a FM radio system, the 12 channels being carried from the Summerside telephone office to the radio repeater station on two wires. Six of these channels will be by Summerside and six by Charlottetown. The calls handled over this route will be for Upper Canadian and United States points. The Tea Hill installation will handle traffic between Charlottetown and Nova Scotia points.

This new routing of traffic will relieve the congestion on the Summerside - Charlottetown circuits and speed up the service in that area. The submarine cables now in use will be continued as a link in the Island communications system.

New Wharf For Fire Pumper At Montague

Almost completed is a new wharf at Montague on which the fire engine will be placed at the time of a fire. On the north side of the river, near the cannery factory of Mr. Leon Johnston, the wharf is 12 feet wide and 16 feet long, resting on four piles. Two 12 x 12 stringers, topped with 5 x 12 joists, and 4 inch planks, have been used to make a substantial small wharf for the pumper. A runway from the bank to the wharf will also be constructed, and on completion will permit easy access to deep water for the suction hose. It is expected that this will facilitate getting the equipment in place, and getting water on fires rapidly on a larger area on the north side of the bridge.
