FREE HOSPITAL PREMIUMS A "BIG JOKE" ... SAID PREMIER SHAW on APRIL 5, 1962

"Premier Walter R. Shaw said in the Legislature yesterday that one of the biggest jokes of the current session, which is to be prorogued this morning, was acting opposition leader Dr. M. L. Bonnell's suggestion that the cost of hospital insurance premiums be paid from the sales tax revenue of the province. . ."

WHEREAS the present government has placed a four per cent sales tax on the people of this Province, AND WHEREAS the present government is unable to administer the Hospital Insurance premium system to the satisfaction of the citizens of this Province, BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that in the opinion of this Legislature the government of this Province take immediate steps to remove the Hospital Insurance premium burden from the taxpayers of this Province and pay the cost out of the consolidated revenue of the Province.
