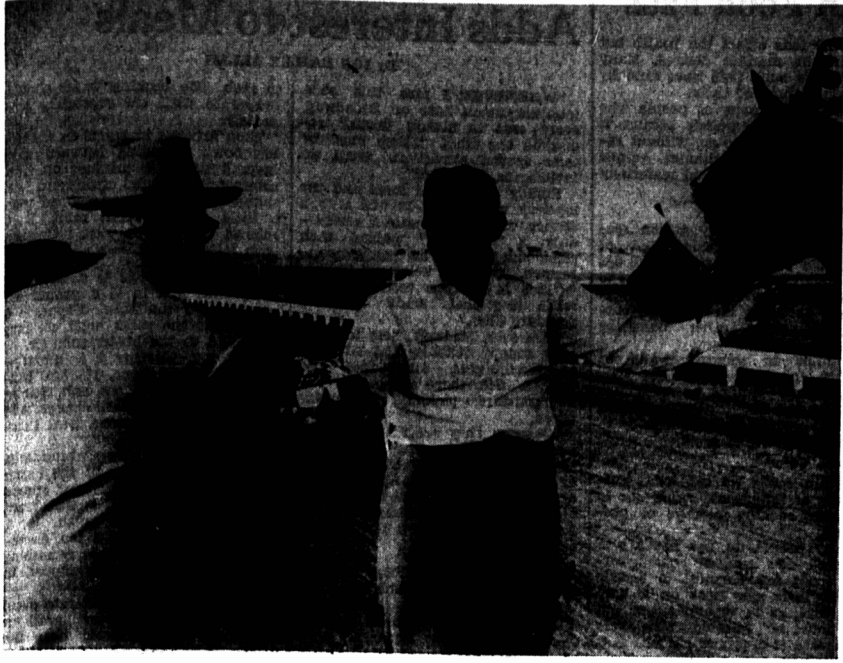

## Palmer Eliminates Two Top Amateurs

DETROIT (AP) — Arnold Palmer, a purposeful young Pennsylvanian, eliminated two of amateur golf's brightest sons Thursday to go into the semi-finals of the 54th United States championship.

Answering the rollcall with Palmer were Dr. Ted Lenczyk of Newington, Conn., who has been playing in the shadow of a famous sister, Grace; Bob Sweeney, 43-year-old investment banker who

won the British Amateur in 1937, and Edward Meister, 36-year-old magazine publisher from Wiloughby, O.

The last of the big-name competitors — Frank Stranahan, Bill Campbell, Don Cherry and Dale Lock — were sent to the sidelines Thursday.

In today's 36-hole semi-finals, Palmer plays Meister and Sweeney goes against Lenczyk.

Palmer defeated Stranahan 3 and 1 in the morning and downed Cherry 1 up in the afternoon. Cherry won the Canadian crown in 1953.

## Billy Graham Dropped From Ring Ratings

NEW YORK (AP) — For the first time in years, the name of Billy Graham is missing from the top 10 of boxing's welterweight division.

The 31-year-old veteran of over 100 pro fights was dropped from the 147-pound division's elite in the latest Ring Magazine's ratings, released Wednesday as the result of his loss to unheralded and oft-beaten Chris Christensen of Denmark.

Earl Walls of Toronto ranked ninth among the heavyweights.

Harold Johnson of Philadelphia held on to his No. 1 contender's post in the light heavyweight division because of his good scrap with champion Archie Moore but middleweight Rocky Castellani, who was outclassed by champion Bobo Olson, fell from No. 1 to No. 2.

Joey Giardello of Philadelphia was moved up into the top contender's position.

## Giants Split With Cubs; Braves Gain Half-Game

While New York Giants were splitting with Chicago Cubs Thursday, the third-place Milwaukee Braves edged Philadelphia Phillies 3-2 to gain a half-game in the National League leaders.

In the American League, rookie Bob Grim pitched New York Yankees to an 11-2 win over Detroit Tigers. These were the only daytime games in the major leagues.

Danny O'Connell was the Milwaukee hero. His ninth-inning single with the bases loaded and two out chased across the winning run. The hit was the seventh off Herm Wehmeier, who went the distance for the Phillies. Ernie Johnson, who relieved Braves starter Jim Wilson in the seventh, got credit for the win, Milwaukee's fourth straight.

The Cubs snapped a seven-game losing streak by winning 4-3 in the opener, but New York snapped back with a 2-1 win in the nightcap. Dusty Rhodes batted in both New York runs in the victory, No. 19 for Johnny Antonelli.

Palph Kiner's 20th homer scored the lone Cub run in the loss, the 15th for Bob Rush, who has won eight.

Willie Mays' 38th homer with one aboard had the Giants ahead in the opener, but throwing errors and a Kiner single won the game for the Cubs in the eighth frame. Warren Hacker was the winner, and Marv Grissom the loser.

The split left the Giants 1-2 games ahead of the idle Brooklyn Dodgers and 6 1-2 ahead of Milwaukee.

Irv Noren had four straight hits as the Yankees won their fourth straight. Detroit dropped into fifth place, a half-game behind Boston Red Sox. Dick Marlowe, third Detroit hurler, was the loser, while Grim brought his record to 17-5.

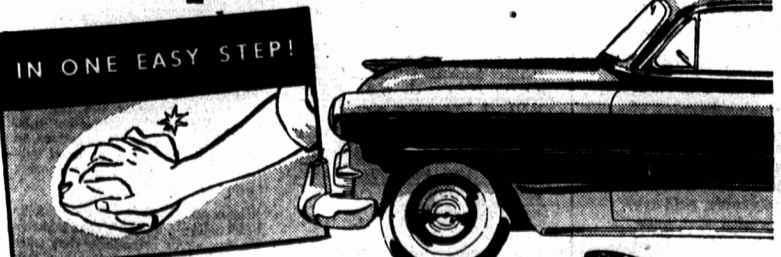
