Let's Talk It Over

It is encouraging to see interest being shown by some of Summerside's public men in the alarming spread of juvenile delinquency in our town. Two important remedial factors are being discussed: the matter of establishing in our Island Province an industrial farm where such delinquents could live and work in wholesome surroundings; and the institution of a Big Brother movement, which would attack the problem prior to court convictions, and endeavour to get the boys interested in worthwhile pursuits.

It seems fairly certain that among young men of post-school age, the unemployment picture, fostering a feeling of frustration in young minds, contributes much to juvenile delinquency. Unemployment insurance, if they are eligible for it, gives them a little money to spend, but does nothing to take up their time, or to give them a sense of achievement. They are left to their own resources, and the old adage, "Mischievous work for idle hands to do" is still true.

A boy who is kept busy, whether it be at sports, or in ordinary occupation, stands a good chance to escape the snares of delinquency, unless inherited tendencies are very strong. The problem is complicated and difficult, of course, and present conditions cannot be cured overnight, but the fact that our leading citizens are alive to the alarming situation, and are taking steps, or at least, considering ways and means to combat it, gives hope that conditions will eventually improve.

S'side Board of Trade Regular Monthly Meeting

Mr. A. S. Hopkins, president of the Summerside Board of Trade, presided at the regular monthly meeting held last night in the Town Hall. It was announced that the annual meeting of the board would be held on January 27th and a nominating committee consisting of Messrs. T. Earle Hickey, C.A., R. S. Hinton, and E. P. Foley was appointed to bring in a slate of officers for the coming year.

Several letters from the Summerside Town Council were read. One dealt with the matter of parking signs at the east end of the town, which the Board had requested be erected. The letter advised that the matter was in the hands of the Police Department for attention.

Another letter from the Council referred to a request from the Board to take some action regarding certain buildings in Summerside which were regarded as fire hazards. The letter pointed out that this was a matter which should be referred to the attention of the Provincial Fire Marshal and that future correspondence should be directed to him and not the Town Council.

Mr. Herbert Stright, reporting for the air and mail service committee stated that the Postmaster had been contacted in regard to the matter of having the Post Office lobby open longer hours and during holidays.
