

Leafs Miss Chance As Detroit Team Wins 3-0

TORONTO, (CP)—Toronto Maple Leafs, fighting for a place in the National Hockey League playoffs, missed a golden opportunity Saturday night as they bowed 3-0 to the mighty Detroit Red Wings.

The Leafs stood to gain ground on both the Bruins—with whom they were tied for fourth position and the last playoff spot—and the third-place Chicago Black Hawks as both these clubs lost.

A crowd of 13,786 saw the Wings add another two points to their league-leading total as they neared nailing down their fifth straight NHL title.

It was the seventh win for New York in the last nine games with the Bruins.

Boston ran up against a familiar nemesis in the person of ex-Bruin Paul Ronty who set up both goals.

Boston's Johnny Peirson scored in the final period after Hergeshelmer had scored in each of the first two sessions.

Many Attend Funeral of Old-time Boxer

BURBANK, Calif., (AP)—Friends and admirers by the hundreds turned out Saturday for the funeral of James J. Jeffries, last of the old-time heavyweight boxing champions.

The spacious, rambling ranch-type Jeffries home was hardly large enough to accommodate the throng that came to pay final respects to the old "boilermaker," who died in his sleep Tuesday night. He was 77.

Jeffries, who won the world heavyweight championship in 1889 from the great Bob Fitzsimmons, and retired, undefeated, in 1905, had lived here since shortly after the turn of the century.

Quebec Senior League Resigns From The QAHA

MONTREAL, (CP)—The Quebec Senior Hockey League countered a threat of suspension from the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association by resigning Sunday from the C.A.H.A.'s Quebec branch and deciding to operate independently.

The resignation of the Q.S.H.L.—reworked a \$1,000,000 organization on the basis of annual gate receipts through schedule and playoffs—was made effective immediately.

It was accepted by president Martin Conway on behalf of the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association. The Q.A.H.A. itself is already under suspension by the C.A.H.A. for defying the parent body's edict over the playing status of Ron Atwell, a junior, to whom the Q.A.H. considered it had rightly issued a playing certificate.

The resignation motion passed without opposition when a show-of-hands vote was recorded.

During the discussion before the vote, Q.S.H.L. president George Slater outlined the situation and there was general condemnation of the action of the C.A.H.A. in suspending the Quebec branch.

The league's action means there will be no Alexander Cup series between winners of playoffs in the QSHL and the Maritime Major League.

In presenting the situation to the meeting, Slater said:

"If we don't go into the Alexander Cup series we will be suspended by the CAHA. If we are under suspension there are complications because of the CAHA

agreement with professional organizations.

"If we attempt to play against a professional league in a playoff series, that agreement might be affected.

"If we are an independent body we cannot be suspended by the CAHA. As to the professional leagues, I have satisfied myself that our rights will be protected."

What About Players?

Most of the discussion centred about what players might do at the end of the season—if they are free agents and can jump to clubs of leagues under CAHA jurisdiction.

Slater said that at present "our players are under contract and I'm sure the professional bodies will recognize those contracts."

Forrest Keene of Sherbrooke Saints commented that "if a player wants to jump he can do so."

"Players can't sign with another amateur club now—not after Feb. 10," said Slater. "They must abide by the CAHA's regulations. Further, we may be back in the QAHA next year—if the CAHA agrees with what the QAHA contends."

Further discussion brought out the opinion that few players in the QSHL would consider jumping to a league within the CAHA in view of salaries paid in the QSHL.
