Criminal Negligence Trial Opens In Supreme Court

Summerside — The trial of Donald Alexander MacPherson of Parkside, charged with criminal negligence causing bodily harm to Elizabeth Charlotte McKenna, Borden, commenced in Supreme Court at Summerside yesterday before Mr. Justice R.R. Bell.

Deputy Attorney-General J.A. McGilgan is acting for the crown and William W. MacNaught, QC for the defendant. Five crown witnesses were heard yesterday before the trial was adjourned until this morning at 10:30 o'clock.

Dr. J. Bonnell, Montague, formerly of Bedouet told of being summoned to an accident on the afternoon of May 9 last, and on arrival at the scene, which was near Norma's Restaurant, he found Elizabeth McKenna lying on the highway covered with blankets.

The doctor said it was before his legs were broken and after administering medical aid the ambulance was summoned and the girl was taken to Prince County Hospital.

Examination revealed both legs broken above the knee, Dr. Bonnell told the court. He said exploratory surgery was performed by Dr. A.R. Grant to ascertain if she had sustained internal injuries.

Some time later she was put in a body cast, the witness stated, and returned home but had to be readmitted to hospital where she is still confined and unable to walk.

On cross-examination Dr. Bonnell said he was not sure if she was able to walk eventually although he is not a doctor.
