CONFLICT OF AUTHORITY.—An Ottawa despatch says: The fisheries authorities here are likely to have trouble with the maritime provincial authorities over the issue of licenses for oyster fishing. SMALL POX.—An alarming epidemic of smallpox is reported in Essex county, in eastern Ontario, and the Provincial Board of Health, is taking active steps to prevent the spread of the disease, which is distributed over four townships. Twenty cases have already been reported in 11 houses. The disease was brought from Walkerville, opposite Detroit, by a young man who attended a dance at Belleriver Village in the affected district. Several patients, first infected, were treated for chickenpox before the real nature of the disease was discovered.
