Wife Declares Lemay, Rivard Not Friends

MIAMI (CP-AP)—A woman identifying herself as the wife of Canadian Georges Lemay, arrested here last week in connection with a Montreal bank robbery has denied that her husband and fugitive Lucien Rivard are friends.

Rivard, who broke jail in Montreal two months ago, was reported seen in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., about the time Lemay was arrested here. But immigration officials say they have no knowledge of him ever being aboard Lemay's yacht.

FBI officials declined comment on the case Tuesday. A spokesman said no FBI agents have made any statements to anyone on the case and none is planned.

Lemay's wife, Lise, said she is certain her husband had nothing to do with the Montreal robbery that led to his arrest. He was arrested last Thursday after a boat repairman recognized a mug shot displayed by an RCMP officer on the inaugural television program of the Early Bird satellite.

Lemay was picked up aboard his \$25,000 yacht and is being held without bail here on a charge of illegal entry into the U.S.

Nordair said it expects to sell package trips to Niagara Falls to tourists visiting Expo 67.

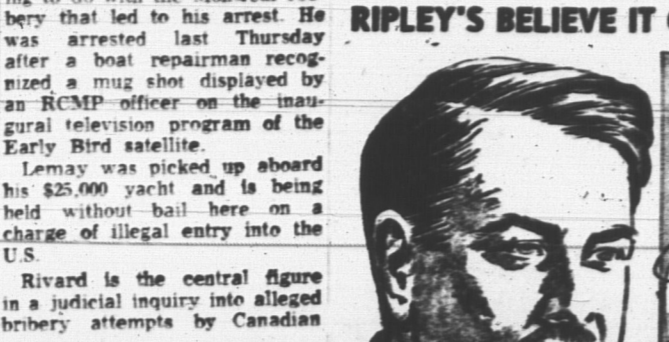

DESCHENES, Que. (CP)—Mayor Rene Paulin is investigating ratepayers complaints about Police Chief Laurent Dubéau.

Weather Bureau Change Proposed At Washington

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson has proposed the consolidation of the U.S. weather bureau and the coast and geodetic survey to create a new agency to be known as the environmental service administrative.

He said organizational improvements made possible by the re-organization plan "will enhance our ability to develop an adequate warning system for the severe hazards of nature—hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, earthquakes and seismic sea waves, which have proved so disastrous to the nation in recent years."

The consolidation proposal was sent to Congress by the president. It will become effective automatically unless the House or the Senate vetoes it within 60 legislative days.

Opening lead—three of spades. Defense is generally considered the most difficult part of the game, but, actually, very few situations arise where the best method of defense cannot be figured out. Doing this may require great diligence at times, but the reward is easily worth the effort.

Let's say you have the East hand and West leads a spade. Declarer plays low from dummy and takes the ten with the ace. He then leads the king of clubs which you win with the ace. The question is what to play now.

It would certainly be easy to go wrong at this point. The
