

# Air Canada's Net Profit Doubled During Last Year

OTTAWA (CP)—Air Canada had a record net profit of \$3,989,960 in 1965, more than double its 1964 showing, it was reported here.

The annual report of the publicly-owned airline, tabled in the Commons by Transport Minister Pickersill, said passenger traffic rose 13 per cent to 4,753,395 passengers. Freight and express revenue jumped 30 per cent.

Since its establishment in 1937 Air Canada, formerly Trans-

Canada Air Lines, has shown profits in 18 years and deficits in 11.

Its largest previous net profit was \$3,890,957 in 1951.

Profit in 1964, was \$1,405,575 and in 1965 it was \$3,989,960.

**SAYS EXCEPTIONAL**

President Gordon R. McGregor said in his report that 1965 was an exceptional year with business volume exceeding all forecasts. He forecast continued expansion in 1966 with another surplus.

Total revenues were \$250,125,520 and income before interest payments reached \$15,287,872. A dividend of \$4 a share was paid on the 50,000 shares of Air Canada stock held by the CNR, the line's parent firm and sole shareholder. The 1964 dividend was \$3.

In addition, capital outlays of \$13,457,548 were made during 1965, chief progress payments on jet aircraft ordered for future delivery. Cash generated in the last two years will be used to meet aircraft payments falling due early this year, the fourth successive year in which no borrowing will be required for capital needs.

Opening lead—queen of clubs. What is it that puts a player on notice that there may be a slam? It is a good question to know how to answer, because when the question does arise, the answer is of more than ordinary importance.

If the slam is not bid but made, the slam bonus, which is sizable, is lost. If the slam is bid but not made, a game is lost in addition to the under-trick penalty.

Point count sometimes helps in making a decision. If both hands are balanced, a combined point count of 33 usually produces two tricks. Where dis-

tribution enters the picture, the slam is frequently made with less points, provided there are sufficient controls in the form of aces, voids or singletons. In either case, bidding a slam is advisable whenever there is better than an even chance of making the slam.

Another guide to slams stems from the all-important rule that an opening bid facing an opening bid means game. Extending this principle to slam bidding, an opening bid plus, facing an opening bid plus, means a slam. By plus is meant an extra trump or ace above an opening bid. Distributional values are considered as plus quantities also.

Note how South appraises his hand here. With a full opening bid his own, expanded in value by North's announced heart fit South has the requisite opening bid plus. North also has it by virtue of his raise to four hearts, not three. The Blackwood four notrump is simply an added precaution to cover the possibility of the opponents having two aces.

The slam is made by tackling the trumps properly. The king of hearts is the first trump led. Only if one defender has all four trumps is the contract in danger. If East has them, it is impossible to avoid a trump loser. But if West has them, his trumps can be trapped by leading the king first.



## Family Planning Counselling Seen Indian & Eskimo Need

OTTAWA (CP)—Better family planning counselling services are urgently needed for Canada's Indians and Eskimos, the Commons health and welfare committee was told by a delegation from the Anglican Church of Canada.

Canon Maurice P. Wilkinson of Toronto, general secretary of the Anglican Church's department of Christian social service, told the committee: "Canada's Indians and Eskimos are being more effectively shut out from the kind of help they need in planning a responsible size of family than any other people in Canada."

Later, Bishop E. S. Reed of Ottawa said the underserved Canadian Indians, now were "the fastest growing racial group anywhere in the world."

He said the committee should recommend that federal subsidies be granted for the provision of family planning services and devices to indigent Indian and Eskimo communities.

The delegation asked the committee to recommend amendments to the Criminal Code legalizing the dispensing of family planning information and devices "under competent medical or other professional guidance" to married persons wishing to plan and space their families in accordance with their physical and economic means.

A similar resolution was passed unanimously by church leaders in 1964.

The health committee is studying a number of private members' bills proposing changes in the Criminal Code in relation to birth control.

The council's resolution is supported by the Anglican, Presbyterian and United churches of Canada, the Churches of Christ, the Evangelical United Brethren, the Greek Orthodox Church, the Salvation Army and the Society of Friends.
