Halifax St. Mary's In 7-0 Shutout Over Beavers

HALIFAX, Dec. 14 — (CP) — Goalie Eddie D'Aoust slammed the door on Saint John Beavers tonight as they were beaten 7-0 by Halifax St. Mary's in a regular fixture of the Maritime Senior Hockey League.

It was the second shutout of the circuit this year. The other belongs to Hal Gordon of Charlottetown Islanders and Beavers were the victims.

Although D'Aoust was not over-worked, he was forced a number of times to produce outstanding skill by the hard-pressing Beavers. He stopped 18 shots, the same number as Dennis Brodeur, in the Saint John cage.

George McGregor, Eddie Diguier, Tom Buck, Frank Grabowski, Billy Watson and Jackie Hollett were the best workmen for Halifax. McGregor, who seemed to be coasting in recent games, came to life with the first two goals of the game.

McGregor's first goal came on an end to end rush just after the game started. Hollett also nabbed a brace, while singles went to Cy Thomas, Gordon Miller and Watson.

For Beavers, Buck Whitlock, Larry Blackburn, Jack Thaler and Bob Mudge turned in sound games. Beavers dressed a new player in Ted Watson, former member of North Sydney Victorias, but they

were minus Tommy Brennan and Manny McIntyre, cut with injuries. Hughie Campbell was off the Halifax lineup because of injuries but his place was ably filled by Buck.

Saint John forced the play as the game started but this quickly ended when McGregor whipped through Beavers and backhanded a shot past Brodeur.

Then Brown slapped one at the net from the blueline. It deflected off McGregor's stick to Brodeur's club and bounded into the corner. Hollett scored the only goal of the close-checking second period, brushing home a pass-out from Watson just past the half-way mark.

Red Wings Whip Bruins 4-2 For 5th Straight Win

DETROIT, Dec. 14 — (CP) — Detroit Red Wings hung up their fifth straight victory as they whipped Boston Bruins 4-2 tonight in a dull National Hockey League game.

Detroit sewed up the decision with a pair of goals in the first seven minutes of play and took things easy the rest of the way before a small turnout of 10,193 fans.

Neither team indulged in hard checking as the game had a paddy-cake tempo at times.

Both Boston goals came while Detroit was short a man on penalties although each team had only three minor offences called against it. The Bruins, who had won five of their last seven starts, fell apart after the first two Detroit goals scored within a minute of each other in the opening stanza.

Change Looms In Ownership Of Moncton Hawks

MONCTON, N. B., Dec. 14 — (CP) — Members of Moncton Hawks of the Maritime Major Hockey League received their weekly pay envelopes late today, two days late, but still were in the dark regarding ownership of the club.

Earlier in the day coach Gordon (Doggie) Kuhn announced that control of the club had been taken over by Lebaron Reid, one of the shareholders. However, a meeting of the committee of the whole of the City Council was told tonight that completion of the transfer of the club would not take place until tomorrow.

Hawks are slated to meet Charlottetown Islanders in a regular league game here tomorrow night. Kuhn announced two new players were expected to join the club in time for the game. Two and possibly three others would arrive before the week-end, he said.

Hawks mentor also announced that Jack Morrow of Montreal, one of the Hawks top goal-getters, had been given his release. It was rumored without confirmation that Gordie Drillon, who preceded Kuhn as coach of the team, would take Morrow's place at right wing for tomorrow night's game.
