Longevity Is Discussed By Civil War Vets

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — What keeps a man alive, tough and ticking well beyond three-score and ten?
"Working hard and making friends and keeping them," says John Salling of Slant, Va.
"Regular habits, an outdoor life and plenty of good food," suggested Walter Williams of Franklin, Tex.
William Allen Lundy, Crestview, Fla., wasn't quite sure. Perhaps moderation in alcohol helps. But probably it's not simply a question of diet, because "I eat anything—anything I can get to eat."
ONLY SURVIVORS
Salling, 110; Lundy, 108; and William, 113 are the three surviving veterans of the U.S. Civil War.
They're southerners—the last northern veteran, Albert Woolson, died last August in Duluth, Minn., aged 109.
On some details of salubrious living the three oldsters agree. Hard work, they feel, has certain medicinal virtues. A vigorous appetite is a blessing; all are, or have been, hearty eaters.
Otherwise, their habits diverge. "Uncle Bill" Lundy, for example, has never taken tobacco in any form in his 108 years and looks with disfavor on people who do. But Salling chews tobacco and enjoys an occasional cigar.
A shot now at the question to Lundy, noted the old soldier's eyes lit up. "When I can get it," Uncle Bill replied.
DAILY TODDY
Texan Williams still insists on his toddy every morning before breakfast. "Makes a person eat hearty," he explained. "But you don't want to be drinking it all during the day."
Salling, who puts much store by hard work as a health factor, remembers how "many a day I've split 100 or more fence rails out of cedar logs for 10 cents a day and then went home and plowed my land with oxen."
He is still in relatively good shape. He sees well but his hearing is poor—"Can't hear thunder without a hearing aid."
Salling's hair is still black, a phenomenon he attributes to "always wearing a hat and never washing my hair." He eats well and drinks about a half-gallon of milk daily. Breakfast is his main meal: three or four eggs, coffee, "plenty of sausage and fatback puffed wheat and a plenty of bread."
