Find Ancient Human Bones In Caves On Borneo Coast

GLASGOW (AP) — Anthropologists may be on the brink of discovering a new line of human evolution in Asia, a leading British scientist said Wednesday. Tom Harrison, curator of the Sarawak Museum in Borneo, recently told the British Association for the Advancement of Science that a unique labyrinth of limestone caves had been found at Niah on the South China Sea coast of Borneo. Elaborating on his announcement, he said in an interview Wednesday the discovery may help throw new light on Asian evolution. Human remains, bones, and tools at least 50,000 years old have already been unearthed. Harrison said a human skull

had been found of almost the same age as Neanderthal man, yet showing very little connection with this early forerunner of modern man. To Harrison this indicates the prehistoric population of Southeast Asia may have evolved along different lines from the peoples of Europe. "After all, people in Asia are Asians—with physical characteristics different from Europeans. The question is, how did they get that way? "We think we are starting to discover real evidence for lateral differences in human development." More than 100 workers are sifting layers of sediment in the 26-acre caves. Harrison said there are several hundred chambers in the caves, some of them as high

145 Grade 12 Students Enroll On First Day

Grade XII's in both academic and commercial subjects reported for opening day registration at Prince of Wales College yesterday. A total of 145 students were on hand in the 1958-59 graduation class's initial day of the new term; 41 in the commercial field and 104 academic students.
